Wednesday June 9th 1841
Commenced with moderate breezes and
clear weather middle light airs and
calms last part moderate breezes from
the S.W. thick and cloudy
No Obs. Lat 40-38 Lon 66-22 W

Thursday June 10th 1841
These 24 hours light winds and calms
what breezes we have had has been
from the E. Wind
Lat 40-39 Lon 65-51 W

Friday June 11th 1841
begins with light breezes from N.W. &
middle Calm last part moderate breeze
from N.W. - the Barometer falling
Obs in Lat 40-29 Long 63-45 W

Saturday June 12th 1841
Commenced with strong breezes from the
N.W. at sundown have too
heaved to the South blowing fresh
took up all the boats on the upper
exposed middle moderate last
part thick rainy 12 Mer broke
in way Wm. Vernalt

Obs in Lat 40-52 Long 62-30 W

For Pacific Ocean A. Brunell's Bark

Sunday June 13th 1841
the 24 hours variable winds and weather
but the most part moderate and light
Obs in Lat 40-51 Long 61-03 West

Monday June 14th 1841
these 24 hours variable and unsteady
Winds from different points with Calms
and showers
No Obs Lat 40-39 N 60-11 West

Tuesday June 15th 1841
Commenced with light baffling winds
from the E. Wind middle to
latter part strong breezes from N.W.
thick and stormy covered in black rain
did not get far No Obs
saw 2 large ships steering W. by N.
Lat 40-54 Long 59-31 West

Wednesday June 16th 1841
Commenced with fresh breezes from the
E. Wind heavy rain middle thick
and Calm last part light winds
from N.W. stormy thick saw 2 sail
from the west head No Obs
Lat 41-08 N Long 59-02 West
