Thursday

Wednesday June 24th 1841

this 24 hours squally rainy and foggy
a little fair weather get one ~~very~~ small
black fish headed on different tracks
Lat by Obs 42-24 long 51-15 West

Friday June 25th 1841

these 24 hours moderate breezes
from SE thick fog the thermometer
towards the freezing point at 10 AM
tacked to the South

Lat Dr 42-48 N long 50-25 West

Saturday June 26th
1841

These 24 hours moderate and unsteady
breezes and thick fog with occasional
light showers winds from SSE to ESE
headed to the south the 24 hours
the thermometer rose a out 10° since
yesterday 10 AM suppose we must have
been near ice the Obs

Lat Dr 41-47 N long 50-20

Sunday June 27th 1841

these 24 hours begins with a thick
fog middle and latter part so
except a brief 2 hours broke a way
have seen 7 or 8 sail headed to the E West
Wind NNE to ENE steered SE to get clear
of the fog

Lat by Obs 41-23 long Cr 48-31 W

towards Pacific Ocean & Bismarck's Bank

Monday June 28th 1841

these 24 hours unsteady breezes from
the North West inclining to Easterly
with the most part fair weather
the men afoot off duty some with
one thing and some another but the
most of them with the V

no Obs Lat Dr 40-37 long 46-51 West

Tuesday June 29th 1841

These 24 hours moderate breezes from
the North to NW with fair weather
have steered to the SE West

5 men off duty

Lat by Obs 39-59 N long 45-27 W Cr

Wednesday June 30th 1841

the 24 hours unsteady winds and squally
but for strong breezes run to the SE day
have too headed to the North have
seen again Grampians Porpoises &c but
no Whale 6 men off duty

Lat by Obs 39-58 long 44-50 Cr

Thursday July 1st 1841

commences with fresh gales equally with
showers of rain middle & latter
part clear and pleasant 6 men off
duty steered to the SE West

Lat by Obs 38-52 N long 41-57 W Cr
