

Bark Mars from New Bedford

Friday July 2nd 1841

There 24 hours light winds from the West Wind fair weather at 6h 30. Fell lowered 2 boats for Black feet got one bone house in
Lat 38-48 Long 40-54 West

Saturday July 3th 1841

There 24 hours light breezy Wind from the West Wind with rain at 10 AM spoke the Bark Marsella Capt Ellis with 500 lbs on board in co with her the rest of the day
Lat by Obs 38-38 N Long 40-08 W Co

Sunday July 4th 1841

There 24 hours windy light Wind from the West Wind clear weather saw no sperm Whales got parted Company with the Bark Marsella at 10 AM as I can't Whale with her but should have been glad to have spent the 4th with them have steered to the N E Lat 38-19 Long 39-47 West

Monday July 5th 1841

There 24 hours moderate breezes from the South fair clear weather steered off to the N E have took at night saw a Bark and a Alaprodite Brig headed to the West both Whale men
Lat by Obs 39-34 N Long 38-56 West

Towards Pacific Ocean & Brunswick

Tuesday July 6th 1841

There 24 light breezes and a clear smooth sea fine weather Wind South to S W steered to the N E have took at night
Lat by Obs 40-24 Long 38-21 West

Wednesday July 7th 1841

There 24 hours moderate breezes fair weather Wind East to S E by the Wind headed to the N with bore several sail have seen gumpers finbacks Porpoises &c
Lat by Obs 41-06 N Long 38-17 West Co

Thursday July 8th 1841

There 24 hours moderate breezes from the So East Wind fine weather steered by the Wind to the N E passed several large pieces of timber seen gumpers Porpoises

Lat by Obs 42-24 N Long 37-53 East Co

Friday July 9th 1841

There 24 hours light breezes from the South sea smooth the water thick with sperm Finbacks and porpoises have seen several sail at a distance and a large Alaprodite ship steering East
Lat by Obs 43-19 N Long 37-02 W Co
