

Bark Alari from New Bedford towards
Saturday July 10th 1841

There 24 hours very light breeze
with calm winds South West and
Westward severe sail in night
have lowered for Black fish 3 times
got one have seen many Porpoises
Black fish squid &c 

Lat 43-36 N Long 56-37 W

Sunday July 11th 1841

There 24 hours very light air
from the NW but the most part
calm there has been a sail of large
ships in sight for 3 days we have had
too with night & but they have had no
wind

Lat by Obs 43-39 Long 36-27 North

Monday July 12th 1841

there 24 hours light breeze and
calm winds from the SE passed
a great number of vessels bound to the
East and West at 10 AM ran into green
water carried it for 10 or 12 miles
but did not round

Lat 43-58 N Long 38-10 W Co

Tuesday July 13th 1841

there 24 hours moderate breeze
from the South fair weather
the Ocean full of Porpoises lowered
for Black fish one got none large
number of vessels

Lat by Obs 45-00 Long 35-02 West Co

Pacific Ocean & Bismarck Bay

Wednesday July 14th 1841

there 24 hours moderate breeze from
the South clear weather lowered twice
for Black fish got nothing seen many
Porpoises for Barks passed great number
of vessels at 11 AM spoke ship John Bentley
of St Johns from Liverpool

Lat 45-32 N Long 34-05 West Co

Thursday July 15th 1841

There 24 hours light breeze from
the West Wind have men to 8 fms
true two nights

Lat 45-56 N Long 32-15 West Co

Friday July 16th 1841

There 24 hours light baffling air
with some calm light showers
have caught a Sunfish Wind South
West and North by

Lat 45-03 N Long 31-14 West Co

Saturday July 17th 1841

There 24 hours moderate breeze with
one or 2 light showers Wind from
WSW to NW passed several sail
Lat by Obs 46-45 N Long 30-26 N Co

Sunday July 18th 1841

Commences with fresh breeze some squally middle
and last part so with quite foggy
saw a Grey steering E by S

Lat 47-35 N Long 29-34 W Co
