Sunday Sept 26th 1841

These 24 hours Winds from the South to
NW and SW clear weather light breezes
carried a Whale ship to the Ward of us
Lat 21-32 S Long 27-05 W Chr

Monday Sept 27th 1841

Commences with moderate breezes from NW
started at 4 PM at 6 PM squally took in
light sails at 8 PM set them but had
light winds and baffling from NW to SW
and ship in light bearing NW

Tuesday Sept 28th 1841

Commences with light airs from the
South middle and last part calm
in Co with a ship

Lat 22-07 S Long 25-12 W

Wednesday Sept 29th 1841

These 24 hours very light baffling
airs and variable with calms at 4 PM
Spoke the ship Paladium of N London
bound to Kardin Ocean Capt Prentiss
H. Menth out in Co

Thursday Sept 30th 1841

These 24 hours very light baffling
airs and calms with variable winds
and some showers sea smooth

Lat 23-02 S Long 24-54 W Chr

Towards Pacific Ocean & Brown's Bay

Friday October 1st 1841

These 24 hours begins with light airs
and variable with calms sea smooth
at 4 AM took a breeze from SW at 6 took
in top gallant sails at 9 AM double reefed
fore top sail last part strong breezes
thick cloudy bad sea from NW

Saturday Oct 2nd 1841

Commences with strong breezes and bad
head sea Wind NW headed to NW at 2 AM
tacked to E Ward last part Winds unsteady
and squally turned out the sea is out
the top sails

Lat 24-12 S Long 25-20 W Cr

Sunday Oct 3rd 1841

These 24 hours strong breezes from NW
to South with much squalls and but
very little rain sea high and had under-
double reef headed to the last strong current
to the N Lat 23-47 S Long 24-01 W Cr

Monday Oct 4th 1841

Commences with fresh and unsteady winds
at NW but sea from South last part
Wind light clear weather at 3 PM
tacked to SW last of the 24 hours
light airs from SE to N
