Tuesday Dec 14th 1841

Commences with strong breezes from South
cloudy middle and last part moderate
in Co with Gen Pipe until 6 AM tacked
to N Wind Bar on 30.01 fell to 30

Lat 33-33 Long 113-28 E

Wednesday Dec 15th 1841

There 24 hours light baffling Winds
and the most part cloudy on disperse
tacks with a current at N Bar 29.04

Lat 33-28 S Long 113-56 E & Cro

Thursday Dec 16th 1841

Commences with light baffling Winds from
South middle calms at 6 AM lowered the
Boats for Black fish got 4 two to bar
so 2 to West boat got one a long side to star
board got another let him go fair play
at 10 AM took a breeze from NW Bar fell to 29.04

Friday Dec 17th 1841

Commences with fresh and unsteady Winds
from NW Middle and last part Co with
squalls and showers of rain at 6 AM spoke
the Ship Massachusetts of Nantucket
3 months out no Oil at 8 AM saw sperm
Whales in the bow came up in 25 min quiet
to Wind Waved next time out of sight a ship
put in sight to seaward suppose she has
been a night there Bar 29.07

Towards Pacific Ocean Abimuel

Saturday Dec 18th 1841

There 24 hours light and unsteady
Winds with a high swell from the West
with heavy squalls that obliges us to downse
mit with stowess Bar 29.07 rising up to 29.14

Lat 35-01 S Long 114-30 E & Cro

tacked to South side seen bearing East 35.16 S
Wind from NW to NW

Sunday Dec 19th 1841

Commences with baffling and unsteady Winds
cloudy headed to West Wind NW to NW
at 6 AM saw Whale on the bow
saw several breaches after dark supposed
them to be sperm Whale at 2 AM tacked to
NE middle and last part ragged with heavy
squalls and showers saw a large English Mer
Ship headed to NW Bar fell from last evening 29.05

Lat 35-04 S Long 114-32 E

Monday Dec 20th 1841

Commences with strong and unsteady Winds with
squalls middle to Wind headed to West at 3 AM
headed to North at 4 AM wore ship to South
the rest of the day last part a gale bore too
at 11 AM bar rose cloudy Bar 29.05 to 29.14

Lat Dec 35-26 S Long 114-43 E & Cro

Tuesday Dec 21st 1841

Commences with a gale at NW equally high sea took
in their boat headed to NW Bar 29.05 began to rise
at 7 AM last part moderate high sea at 6 AM rose
to South West Wind NW at 12 AM light Wind Bar 29.09
