


Bark Murs from N Bedford in

Thursday Jan 27th 1842  
Comences with light breezes from NW  
middle so with showers last part a fresh  
breeze on different tacks saw a Whale ship  
to NW headed to NE Bar on 30  
Set 32-56 S Long 160-33 E

Friday Jan 28th 1842

 There 24 hours strong  
breezes from NW fair  
weather headed to E Ward at 6 AM saw  
Sperm Whale to WNW Ward tacked at 8 o'clock  
got on with Larboard Boat got one son  
of them very rugged got stove some  
got him a long side at 12 o'clock  
Set Obs 33-39 S Long Dr 161-49 E

Saturday Jan 29th 1842

Comences with strong gales from NW  
fair weather middle blew hard in squalls  
last part strong gales and very rugged  
have in our Whale all but the head lay  
a long side to be Ward at the body on  
at 7 AM after tearing the books through  
the blanket feed several times went under  
bar once a day light hooked on the head  
tasted it in barrel at decks comences  
Boiling at 11 AM Bar 29-08 to 30  
Set Obs 34-02 S Long 161-15 E Bar

Pacific Ocean Whaling Allen Brownell <sup>Capt</sup>

Sunday Jan 30th 1842  
There 24 hours strong gales  
and rugged headed to NW middle  
squally with some heavy showers  
Bar rising on 30 boiling the 24 hours  
Set 33-32 S Long 160-31 E Bar

Monday Jan 31st 1842

There 24 hours strong gales from NW headed to  
NW at 6 AM more ship to East headed on the  
western tack the rest of day at 4 AM finished  
boiling the oil filled from Coder 54 blbls  
Set 33-40 S Long 161-07 E Bar about 30

Tuesday Feb 1st 1842

There 24 hours moderate breezes and fair  
weather had see at 5 AM saw Whales  
on the lee bow going NW then all landed  
but could not get near as far as they  
was going headed to E Ward most part  
Bar 29-09 to 30  
Set 34-07 S Long 161-13 E Bar

Wednesday Feb 2nd 1842

Comences with light breezes from NW fair  
weather middle part at 8 AM squally and  
showery the rest of day comences storming  
down after breaking out  
Bar on 29-09  
Set Dr 34-14 S Long Dr 162-7 E
