Sunday Feb 27th 1842

Commences with strong breezes from N
at 1 o'clock tacked to South at 5 o'clock tacked to
N at 4 o'clock tacked to South wind headed
off hauler out with at sunrise at 11 o'clock tacked
to East North Cape bearing N.W. Compass
35 bar middle and last part moderate amount
at Obs in 34-11 Hvy 174-01 & Bar about 30

Monday Feb 28th 1842

Commences with fresh gales at 11 at 2 o'clock
very squally with thunder and light rain
& with heavy showers middle and last
part light airs and Calms Bar 29.08 to 30.00
Lat Obs 34-22 Hvy 173-52 & bar

Tuesday March 1st 1842

These 24 hours begins with light baffling
airs and Calm swell bearing us to West Wind
at 2 o'clock light airs at 8 o'clock headed in shore
made several tacks Wind from E to S.W.
at 12 o'clock the land on West side of Laureston
Bay bore 170 Lat 34-55 S. L. Calm on 30 to 30.5

Wednesday March 2nd 1842

These 24 hours begins with light breezes and
fair weather Middle to last part fresh gales
at 8 o'clock the Wind has been from S.E. to S.W.
at 5 o'clock spoke a Schooner from Bay Islands 6 1/2
on different tacks beat up to Windward
of Cavalloer gales tacked with the passage long
N.E. by E 8 miles Sea set to Wind Bar on 30 to 30.5
Lat Obs 34-54 South

Pacific Ocean Whaling Abnwick's Book

Thursday March 3rd 1842

Commences with moderate breezes and clear
weather beating up to the passage at 11 o'clock get in
off the nine o'clock lay off Cape Horn all night
at day light made all sail beat up for the
Bay of Islands got up above Canatiken at 1 o'clock
anchored in 10 fathoms Wind from S.W.
to N.E. last part thick rainy

Thursday March 24th 1842

Commences with fresh and unsteady breezes and
fair weather at 2 o'clock sea account got under
way and run down against the tide and
at 6 o'clock the nine o'clock bore 15 o'clock
never was so rejoiced to get to sea before
last part moderate weather at Cape N.W. at 12 o'clock
Lat Obs 34-19 Hvy 173-37

Friday March 25th 1842

These 24 hours moderate and unsteady
breezes with heavy smoky weather
bore too at Cape bearing S.E. Wind at 8
headed to North at 12 o'clock 3 things bore
N.W. Lat Obs 34-01 Wind N.E. to S.E.
Bar on 29-08 the 24 hours

Saturday March 26th 1842

These 24 hours begins with light airs and
Calms middle to shores last part fresh
breezes from N.W. to N.E. fair weather
bore too during the night North Cape bearing N.E.
8 mile set at 12 o'clock 3 things South bar fell to 29.06
Lat Obs 33-36 Hvy 172-24 &
