

Bank Mass of New Bedford

Sunday March 27<sup>th</sup> 1842  
Comences with squally weather Wind  
S W at 4 P.M. bore too headed to West  
under low reef all top with spence to  
stay sail lay the rest of 24 hour  
middle and last part blowing strong  
in squalls Bar on 29.06 rose to 29.08 but fell  
Sat 32-55 S Long 171 47 E

Monday March 28<sup>th</sup> 1842  
Comences with a gale from S W  
at 8 P.M. moderates middle and last part  
moderate high and confused sea Wind at  
South Bar rose gradually from 29.08 up to 30.01  
Sat Obs 32-30 S Long 170-54 E

Tuesday March 29<sup>th</sup> 1842  
These 24 hours light breezes from N E with  
most part cloudy heavy weather but the  
old spence and jib Bar up to 30.02

Wednesday March 30<sup>th</sup> 1842  
Comences with light breezes from the  
N E middle calm last part a moderate  
breeze from W N clear weather Bar down to 30  
Sat Obs 31-35 S Long 169-17 E

Thursday March 31<sup>st</sup> 1842  
Comences with strong breezes from S W squally  
middle moderate but sea the rest 24 hours  
breezes quite moderate at 10 P.M. saw 2 Whales  
got part bar board boat Bar 29.9 at to 30.1  
Sat 31-22 S Long about 168 E

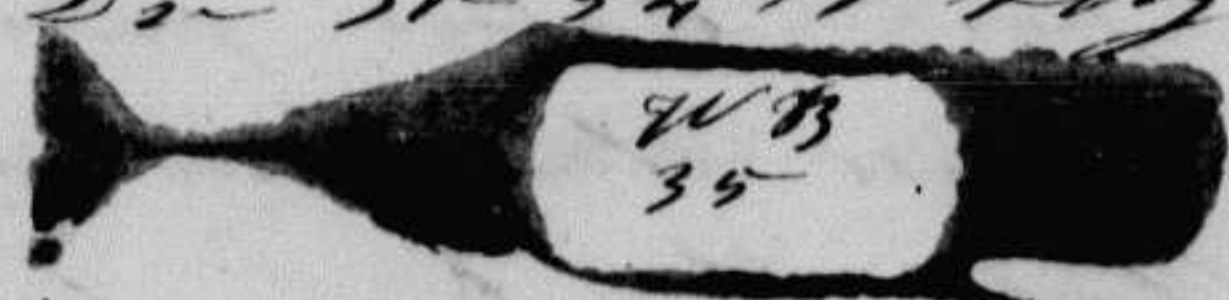

Friday April 1<sup>st</sup> 1842  
Comences with light baffling Winds high  
well Wind at 8 P.M. at 2 P.M. got a small  
Whale a long side turned him off to Southward  
to get the run of the rest at 3 P.M. looked too  
cut him in had cutting at 5 got him in  
balled the case but up the junk comenced  
in the morning boiling last part light  
air Calves Bar up to 30.01  
Sat 31-35 S Long 167-54 E

Saturday April 2<sup>nd</sup> 1842  
Comences with moderate breezes from S W  
finished boiling at 6 P.M. filled a boat  
10 lbs middle squally winds light  
run N W at 1 P.M. bore too all night run N W  
at 9 P.M. saw Whales lowered got part  
Wain boat killed him rose got on  
bar board boat had jib running  
had not beat at 12 o'clock blowing up strong  
at 8 P.M. as much as the boats could do to  
live Bar falling from 30

Sat Obs 31-35 S Long 167-19



Sunday April 3<sup>rd</sup> 1842  
Comences with strong gales from S W at 2 P.M. got  
two Whales a long side succeeded in getting the  
small one in lay by the other blowing a gale from  
S W to S W with heavy squalls & rain  
had sea at 8 P.M. moderates at 10 P.M. were ship  
backed on got the head off at 12 o'clock had  
sea but moderating Bar from 30 down to 29.08  
Sat Obs 31-41 S Long 166-42 E
