Monday April 11th 1842

Commences with light winds from NW  
high sea middle and last part calm  
at day light commenced breaking out to storm  
down commenced raining down at 12 o'clock  
Bar fell on Bar on 29.09

Set Obs 31.09 1 long a bar 168.00

Tuesday April 12th 1842

Commences with a calm middle so at day  
light took a moderate breeze from NW  
lasted the rest of the day storm down  
the oil stowed down 60 bbls 26 gal Bar long 29.09

Set Obs 31.15 1 long 168.11 8 Cms

Wednesday April 13th 1842

these 24 hours begins with moderate breezes  
from NW cloudy middle thick squalls heavy  
rain and variable get out 11 at 12 o'clock at 10 AM  
broke a way fair weather steered off NW  
Bar in 29.05 to 9

Set 31.18 1 long 167.30 8 Cms

Thursday April 14th 1842

Commences with moderate breezes at 4 AM equally  
double reefed have too at dark under spencers  
at day light steered off NW middle  
and last part strong gales Bar rose 29.09 to 9

Set Obs 30.14 1 long 167.06 8 Cms

Friday April 15th 1842

Commences with a gale from NW at 1 AM  
have too under the spencers middle and  
latter part more moderate steered to NW  
strong current to East Bar rose 29.08 to 30.02

Set 29.38 1 long 166.53 8 Cms

Saturday April 16th 1842

Commences with moderate breezes from the  
South fair weather middle calm at 9 AM breeze  
from NW made all sail Bar on 30.02

Set 29.23 1 long 166.10 8 Cms

Sunday April 17th 1842

these 24 hours begins with light breezes from  
South middle and last part sea calm Bar 30.02 to 3

Set Obs 29.04 to long 165.51 8 Cms

Monday April 18th 1842

These 24 hours begins with a calm middle  
so last part a moderate breeze from across  
clear weather Bar fell from 30.02 down to 30

Set 29.03 1 long 165.28 8 Cms

Tuesday April 19th 1842

these 24 hours begins moderate breezes from NW  
fair weather middle so thick weather latter  
latter strong gales and stormy Bar on 30.02 down 29.09

Set Dr 28.53 1 long to 164.34
