These 24 hours light baffling air and
calm current to N E Bar 30-01

Lat 25-54 S Long 160-47 E Eros

Tuesday May 10th 1842

Comences with light airs from the North
swell from South middle and last part line
bore from NW Bar 30 & 12 then down 29-09

Lat 26-38 S Long 160-41 E Eros

Wednesday May 11th 1842

Comences with fresh breezes from NW
Middle squally with showers last part
strong gales from NW Bar down to 29-08 then

Lat 27-48 S Long 160-42 E Eros

Thursday May 12th 1842

Comences strong gales from WNW middle
unsteady and squally varying to South
last part baffling and unsteady from the
South ran last Bar 29-07 rising up to 30-00

Lat 28-02 S Long 161-08 E Eros

Friday May 13th 1842

Comences with baffling and unsteady winds
and showers Wind S E middle and last part
steady breezes from the S E Bar 30-00 30-01

Lat 27-05 S Long 162-12 E Eros

Pacific Ocean Whaling & Burnett Cook

Saturday May 14th 1842

These 24 hours moderate breezes and fair weather
headed to South Wind at last Bar 30-01 & 2

Lat 27-46 S Long 162-02 Eros

Sunday May 15th 1842

These 24 hours some part very light
with squalls and showers Wind from
N E to E N headed to South at 10 AM
Saw 3 sperm Whales 1 entered got on
with harpoon boat killed him
Noch. On 28-20 S 162-16 E Eros



Monday May 16th 1842

These 24 hours light baffling air calm
from the East Wind at 1 PM got the
Whale a long ride got him all in at 6 PM
baled the case and comenced boiling at
mid on the head Bar on 30 to 30-01

Lat Obs 28-21 S Long 161-43 E Eros

Tuesday May 17th 1842

Comences with light airs from E to SE some
showers last part fresh gale from N E cloudy
at 10 AM finished boiling the Whale Bar 30-01 29-09

Lat 28-04 S Long 161-50 E Eros
