

Bark Mars from N Bedford in
Wednesday May 18th 1842

Commences with fresh breezes from W to NW
cloudy here too & dark under spencer's line
up M top sail & 12 o'clock set in thick and
stormy took in fore top mast stay sail & spencer's
& 3 AM blowed with great violence in squalls
rain pouring down in torrents & 8 AM went down
top gal yards so old bble oil on deck ends with
a heavy gale hand ran Bar falling 29.09 to 29.08 12 AM 29.06
Lat about 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ Long 161.90

Thursday May 19th 1842

Commences with a heavy gale and stormy & 2 AM
most violent squalls with Whirl Winds died
suddenly shifted 7 or 8 points several times
rain coming down in torrents took in Main top
sail lay under fore spencer Bar at this time 29.05
& 4 PM broke away at Main top sail had cross
seas Wind at again head to North middle fresh
and unsteady breezes from East last part
light airs and calm Bar does not rise 29.06

Lat 28-18 S Long 161-24 E Eve

Friday May 20th 1842

Commences with a calm & 2 PM got a moderate
breeze from NW lasted the 24 hours
heavy swell from the East steered E by N
had some light showers Bar 29.06 - 12 AM 29.07
No Ob Lat 28-39 S Long 162-25 E

Saturday May 21st 1842

These 24 hours light baffling and variable
Winds and calms squalls thunder lightning
bad swell from East Bar 29.07

Lat 28-39 S Long 162-55 E

Pacific Ocean Whaling & Brownells Creek

Sunday May 22nd 1842

These 24 hours light baffling airs and
variable with some squalls and showers
working to Eward Bar 29.06 at 4

Lat 28-26 S Long 163-54 E Eve

Monday May 23th 1842

Commences with strong breezes and heavy squalls
middle and latter part more moderate
with squalls and showers Wind N to South Bar 29.08 at 4

Lat 28-10 S Long 165-06 Eve

Tuesday May 24th 1842

Commences with baffling winds and squally
with showers wind South Easterly middle light
and baffling last part moderate breezes and heavy
wind at NW Bar 29.07 to 8

Lat 28-12 S Long 166-11 E Eve

Wednesday May 25th 1842

These 24 hours begins with moderate
breezes from NW Bar 29.07 took sail & 6 AM
to double reef all top sail fore sail middle
fresh gales and squally rain at 12 o'clock home
two at day light made sail to Eward
last part a gale ran under fore sail
double reef all top sail at 10 AM saw
Norfolk Island bearing E by N
& 12 AM had to steer off to South
and pass to South off. here at 12 E by N
15 Miles but ends with a heavy squall
Wind NW Bar at 12 o'clock 29.05
