These 24 hours fine breezes and fair weather
no Whales passed the whole length of
Knox Island to 12 Miles Charlotte and Matthews
Isles in sight Bar 29.08

Friday July 22nd 1842

these 24 hours fresh breezes from East
fair weather sun off and hauled round
the West end of Charlotte Is. at 6 AM hauled
by the Wind to South continued till 4 PM Bar 29.52

Saturday July 23rd 1842

These 24 hours moderate breezes and fair
weather at 6 AM left off NW Wind 8 PM

Lat 00-19 N Long 171-24 E Bar 29.08

Sunday July 24th 1842

These 24 hours light baffling airs
and variable with Calms some light
showers strong current to W Bar 29.08

Lat 00-09 N Long 172-15 E

Monday July 25th 1842

these 24 hours light baffling airs and Calms
with some light showers of rain Bar 29.09

These 24 hours light airs from the
North fair weather very hot Bar 29.08

Lat 00-43 N Long 171-08 E

Wednesday July 27th 1842

These 24 hours light airs from W & S
fair and hot no Whales Bar 29.08

Lat 00-46 N Long 170-28 E

Thursday July 28th 1842

These 24 hours light airs and variable
with some squalls sun out. our long looking
for Ocean Island not to be found yet.
What a situation Bar 29.1

Lat 00-51 N Long 169-48 E

Friday July 29th 1842

Commences with a squall morning at 11 AM
more ship in a squall to East Wind at 1 PM
sun into a large shoal of them homered all the
boats got 2 stone & shot one boat got them
along side at dark cut them all in 12 Miles
Bar 29-8 at 9 sweating and drenched with rain
took a cold in the greatest misery could neither
sleep by day nor at night with the rheumatism
in both shoulders pain in breast cold chills
no Rebecca nor Mother to take care of me
