of the time and higher made good Bar 29.09

Wednesday August 10th 1842

Commences with moderate breezes from ESE
to East middle heavy showers lightning
last part fresh breezes from ESE
current not so strong Bar 29.08.9
Lat 06-20 S Long 169-58 E Circ

Thursday August 11th 1842

These 24 hours fresh and unsteady
breeze from ESE at 5 till tacked to NE
at 7 till tacked to South Bar 29.08
Lat 06-07 S Long 169-22 E

Friday August 12th 1842

These 24 hours strong and unsteady
breezes from SE squally with showers
thunder lightning headed to South till tacked
to ESE the rest of day Bar 29.08
Lat 6-34 S Long 169-31 E Circ

Saturday August 13th 1842

These 24 hours begins strong breezes squally
thunder lightning middle and last part
light hazy air had sea Bar 29.08.9
Lat 07-22 S Long 169-34 E Circ

Commences with a calm at 10 till took a light
breeze from NE wind continued the rest of the
day had small from the SE made but little
head way Bar 29.09

Monday August 15th 1842

Commences with calm latter part light
Winds from SE headed to South Bar 29.09
Lat 8-05 S Long 169-44 E Circ

Tuesday August 16th 1842

Commences with moderate breezes fair weather
last part fresh unsteady and squally in
current tacks three SE to East Bar 30.00
Lat 07-47 S Long 170-22 E Circ

Wednesday August 17th 1842

These 24 hours strong trades from SE headed
to South high sea strong westerly current
it is perplexing beating here under present
circumstances but our divine Master knows
what is best for us Bar 29.09
Lat 09-31 S Long 169-35 E Circ

Thursday August 18th 1842

These 24 hours strong breezes and squally
Wind from SE Sea had Bar 29.09
Lat 10-32 S Long 168-53
