Friday August 19th 1842

There 24 hours strong breezes from S^W squally unsteady winds some heavy showers Bar 29-09 No Obs

Lat 11-28 S Long 167-50 E & Co

Saturday August 20th 1842

There 24 hours strong gales from S^W squally some showers kept on back track half night Bar 29-09

Lat 12-23 S Long 164-21 E & Co

Sunday August 21st 1842

Commences strong breezes and fair weather but part more moderate made Torres Island & fell over down round the N^W end of them Obs Lat 13-10 S Long 166-31 E Co Bar 29-09 near 20 miles to far by the line

Monday August 22nd 1842

There 24 hours begins moderate breezes S^W middle and last part fresh from N^W ran 3 hours on easterly track Bar 30-00

Lat 13-50 S Long 165 16 E Co

Tuesday August 23rd 1842

There 24 hours fresh trades fair weather Winds N^W & S^W fell tracks to East carried all sail during night & 12 all made the South end of Torres Group & 12 all bore N^W & 5 miles Lat Bar 29-09 Lat 13-32 S Long 166 31 E Co

Wednesday August 24th 1842

There 24 hours strong and unsteady breezes from S^W last part thick and stormy Headed to N^W 24 hours Bar 29-09 No Obs Lat 12-30 S Long 168-10 E Co

Thursday August 25th 1842

Commences with thick stormy weather middle more moderate last part fair weather all sail set made short tracks during night & 12 all made Pichilinga Bay N^W & N Bar 29-08 Lat 29-24 to 20

Lat 13-06 S Long 168-00 Co

Friday August 26th 1842

There 24 hours strong gales and squally carried a breeze of sail the 24 hour Wind S^W to N^W head 6 hours to N^W set to East Lat 12-46 S Long 165-51 E Co

Saturday August 27th 1842

There 24 hours begins strong gales from N^W squally high sea middle S^W last part more moderate Bar 29-09

Lat 12-12 S Long 169-54 E Co

Sunday August 28th 1842

There 24 hours fresh and unsteady winds from East to S^W headed 4 hours to N^W Bar 29-09

Lat 13-22 S Long 169-38 E Co
