Commences fine breeze from East fair weather last part squally and unsteady showers rain from East to West Bar 29.94
Lat Dec 19-40 S Long 150-42 E

Saturday Oct 8th 1842

these 24 hours very unsteady breezes and squally with Storms and calms Wind from NE to North Bar 29.09
Lat Dec 19-26 S Long 148-56 E bro

Sunday Oct 9th 1842

these 24 hours moderate and unsteady breezes from North fair weather on different tacks but made nothing Bar 29.92
Lat Dec 19-18 S Long 148-53 S

Monday Oct 10th 1842

these 24 hours moderate and baffling winds from the North with calm & middle light Wind from East Bar 29.09
Lat not to depend on 19-00 S Long 148-20 E

Tuesday Oct 11th 1842

these 24 hours light wind and variable most of time at East at day light came the East end of Otaheite bearing W 3/4 S and Matae East had the winds light and baffling at 12 Noon Otaheite East end bore NW 1/2 W Lat Dec 19-48 South

Commences light winds from NW middle calm at day light get under way light land breeze was assisted to turn off out side the reef by the boats in harborment in get all the men off that we stayed here lay in Otaheite 20 days going off and on strong trade down

Wednesday Nov 2nd 1842

these 24 hours begins strong gales under double reef at 2 PM 1 got off from the shore bore up from North breeze at 8 PM calm breeze bearing East 12 miles passed got a breeze from East end South day light kept off NW 1/2 W at 8 AM Matae 1/2 mile North 20 miles East last part stormy with thunder lightning no obs

Thursday Nov 3rd 1842

these 24 hours fresh and unsteady winds from NE to SE cloudy with showers
Lat Dec 18-32 Long Dec 153-30 W Bar 30.00 to 4

Friday Nov 4th 1842

Commences with fresh and unsteady winds with Showers middle and last part fair weather Wind East to SE Bar 30.00
Lat Dec 18-12 S Long 155-03 W
