Sunday Nov 6th 1842

fr There 24 hours fresh and unsteady
breezes from NE to SE fair weather
Lat Obs 19-33 S Long 158-49 E by Gro
strong hatterly current Bar 30

Monday Nov 7th 1842

There 24 hours fresh breezes and fair
weather Wind SE to NE have too
during the night Bar 29 94
Lat Obs 18-37 S Long 159-24

Tuesday Nov 8th 1842

there 24 hours fresh gales from SE to
to SE fair weather, except some showers
at 1 bell ran Coakutsee bearing 14711
run down bay by until day light
at 7 AM out the boat on shore got some
Potatoes a few games and found returned
at 11 AM

Wednesday Nov 9th 1842

there 24 hours fresh and unsteady winds
from NE to SE lying off and on at
Whytatooken got off 2 boat loads of
games fresh Cucumbers and pine apples
times pumpkins &c

in Pacific Ocean Whaling Brownell

Thurs Nov 10th 1842

Commences with moderate breezes and fair weather
Wind at SE & NE at 4 bell set in rainy poured
down in torrents until 11 bell last part squally
with some showers Wind SE and varying in ^{velocity}
at 12 h 30 min Call got off from Whytatooken
and brought one of the Natives with us they
appear to be a honest people for savages
Lat Obs 19-52 S Long 161-42 West

Friday Nov 11th 1842

There hours moderate breezes from SE
with some light showers Bar 29-98
Lat 20-34 S Long 163-10 West Gro

Saturday Nov 12th 1842

Commences with fair weather middle and
last part Wind shifting from NE to SE
and some times round the Compass
with heavy showers of rain Bar 29-96 to 29-08
Lat 20-56 S Long 164-25

Sunday Nov 13th 1842

There 24 hours light haphing and
variable Winds with showers and calm
the greater part Calm Bar 29-08-9
Lat Obs 21-24 S Long 165-00 Gro

Monday Nov 14th 1842

there 24 hours moderate breezes from NE
fair weather Mr Nute getting better Wind
rather freshen latter part Bar 29-08-9
Lat Obs 21-38 S Long 166-11 E Gro
