These 24 hours moderate breezes and fair weather all 24 days running under short sail night wind at North Bar 29.09
Lat Obs 22-29 S Long 167-50 W Cro

Wednesday Nov 16th 1842

These 24 hours fresh gales from North fair weather all sail at Bar 29.08
Lat Obs 23-29 S Long 169-50 W Cro

Thursday Nov 17th 1842

Commences with light from the North and fair weather Middle the latter part light and baffling with showers Bar 29.09
Lat Obs 24-15 S Long 170-30 W Cro

Friday Nov 18th 1842

These 24 hours begins with light baffling airs and Calms middle S but part moderate breeze from NE clear weather Bar 29.08 to 9
Lat Obs in 24-26 S Long 171-25 W Cro

Saturday Nov 19th 1842

These 24 hours baffling and unsteady wind from NE to NE fair weather
Lat Obs 25-22 S Long 172-35 W Bar 29.9

Sunday Nov 20th 1842

These 24 hours moderate breezes from NE to NE fair weather I & J saw Whales a head lowered the boat but could not get near them before night or dark going quick to NE carried sail all night tacked to NE I & J saw 7 but saw them to windward but a long dist off wind light lowered I 10 AM but could not get near them Bar 29.09
Lat Obs 25-55 S Long 173-15 W Cro

Monday Nov 21st 1842

These 24 hours moderate and unsteady winds fair weather Wind NE to NE made several tacks the Whales went out of sight to Windward I & J saw 3 but carried sail tacked back but saw nothing of them Bar 30.00
Lat Obs 26-39 S Long 174-00 W Cro

Tuesday Nov 22nd 1842

These 24 hours light variable winds from NE to NE fair weather Bar 29.9 to 30
Lat 27-30 S Long 175-13 W Cro

Wednesday Nov 23th 1842

Commences with very light air from NE Middle Calm latter part some light air from NE Bar 29.09 to 30
Lat 27-48 S Long 175-13.8 Cro
