

Bark Mars of New Bedford in

Thursday Nov 24th 1842
Commences with a calm middle so last
part fresh breeze from NE to NW Bar 29.09
Lat 27-52 N long 175-39 E End

Friday Nov 25th 1842
There 24 hours baffling and unsteady
winds from the South fair weather
beated to West 24 hours Bar 30.00
Lat 27-53 N long 177-11 E End

Saturday Nov 26th 1842
There 24 hours light airs from
the South with clear weather some
current to NW Bar 30.04
Lat 27-37 N long 178-24 E End

Sunday Nov 27th 1842
There 24 hours light breezes and variable
from NE to NW fair weather Bar 30
Lat 28-02 N long 178-56 E End

Monday Nov 28th 1842
There 24 hours begins calm middle
and latter part took a fine breeze
from NE clear weather at 8 AM saw
Rechenches or Sandey Island bearing
SE at 12 AM bore NE
Lat 28-00 N long 178-08 End

Pacific Ocean Whaling & Brownells Book

Tuesday Nov 29th 1842
Commences with moderate breezes and fair
weather run round the on the South
side of Sandy Isle or Rechenches and back
to the East Wind NE middle fresh
breezes last part strong breezes then to
more shift to NW at day light at 6 AM
saw Whales at 9 AM got one a long side
to Starboard boat got his head up at 12 AM
had sea strong gales Bar falling to 29.07
Lat 28-34 long 177-36 E



Wednesday Nov 30th 1842
Commences strong gales from NE at 4 AM
got the Whale all in bailed the case cleaned
decks at sundown bore too under close reef.
At 10 AM sail middle blowing strong strong
at 1 AM broke away at 10 commenced boiling
wind baffling to NW Bar 29.07-8 AM 29.06 center
Rechenches bearing NW Lat 29-46 N

Thursday Dec 1st 1842
There 24 hours baffling and unsteady
winds and calms last part some light
showers with distant thunder boiling the
24 hours nearly all boiled out Bar 29.06
at 12 AM Rechenches bore W by N 30 miles distant
No Obs
