at 6 P.M. saw Whales going to Westward
haved them until 12 M. out at sight
from ship did not get on Bar 30-02.5
Lat Br 33-29 Long 174-33

Tuesday Feb 7th 1843

These 24 hours moderate breezes from ENE to ESE
fair weather took 1 day light for built Bar 30-04
Lat 33-24 Long 174-27.8

Wednesday Feb 8th 1843

These 24 hours unsteady breezes from the
East and fair weather some part light - at 5 P.M.
spoke the Canton Packet Sherman N Bedford
14 M. out 800 lbs sperm Bar 30-01.2

Thursday Feb 9th 1843

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes
from the East fair weather middle and
last part strong gales last part ran off
to SE Bar falling 29-09 12 M. out
Lat 33-03 Long 174-00

Friday Feb 10th 1843

These 24 hours strong gales from East and
overcast weather ran to West 11 M. during
day have too during night headed to North
last part high sea Bar 30-00
Lat 33-17 Long 172-24.8

Saturday Feb 11th 1843

Commences strong gales and fair weather running of to the
West the 24 hours latter part thick with some rain sea
light Wind ENE to SE Bar 30 falling 12 M. out 29-07.5
No Obs 33-46 Long 169-08.5

Sunday Feb 12th 1843

These 24 hours begins strong gales and thick
stormy weather at 3 P.M. took in fore sail have
too headed to SE Wind ESE log under close reef
at 4 P.M. sail fore top sail middle and latter part
of the night a most & violent gale set in the
main boat and got her stove some but a great part
of our Black fish that was in deck put and cooler
took in at top sail at 5 P.M. log the rest 24 hours
under at stone top sail Wind from East 6 P.M.
heavy rain had sea Bar 29-07.5 at 8 P.M. 29-05.5
at 12 M. 29-03.5
no Obs

Monday Feb 13th 1843

Commences with strong gales and stormy from NE to SE
high sea middle and last part moderate and the
most part fair weather our off 1 day light to the
West North to NE Bar born at 29-05.5 during 12 M. 29-03.5
Lat Obs 33-29 Long 167-55.1

Tuesday Feb 14th 1843

Commences with light and boflying airs from
the North middle to last part last part
unsteady and variable with calms Bar 30
Lat 33-31 Long 167-09.1

Wednesday Feb 15th 1843

These 24 hours moderate and unsteady clouds from West
to NE hazy weather some light showers rain
No Obs started to West Bar 30-00
