Wednesday March 29th 1843

There 24 hours moderates and unsteady breezes and squally and unsettled weather. At day light made the 3 Kings bearing S by E. Winds blowing from the Eastward saw a Schooner to the S Bar 30-1
Lat 34-16 long 171-30 E. 30 miles to the

Thursday March 30th 1843

there 24 hours fresh and unsteady breezes and fair weather all sail set bent up for the 3 Kings fetched up to the North of them at 12 Miles bore South Wind from S by E to S by W Bar 30-02
Lat 34-05 S

Friday March 31st 1843

Commenced with fresh breezes and fair weather at 2 PM went on shore at the 3 Kings but could get no Potatoes as they was not out of the ground could not wait went on board at 4 PM headed to North Wind at East middle and last part strong gales fair weather at 8 PM went ship to the south a Bark in sight to Windward Bar on 30-03 strong current to the S
Lat 35-22 S long 173-10 E. 10 miles

Saturday April 1st 1843

there 24 hours fresh and unsteady Winds from the East fair weather and cloudy wave ship to shell at 8 PM at 4 PM tacked to South at 12 Miles North Cape bore NW by W 15 Miles S. Bar 30-03

Sunday April 2nd 1843

There 24 hours fresh and unsteady winds and cloudy bar sea at 2 PM tacked to North at Cape New Zealand bearing West 10 Miles S. at 4 PM tacked to South & steered in for the Lat Bar 30-02 Wind East
Lat 34-25 S long 174-00

Monday April 3rd 1843

there 24 hours blowing winds and variable from NW to SE squally raining with calm between 30
No Obs at 12 Miles Cape bore bar 34-02 S

Tuesday April 4th 1843

Commenced with light airs and calm blowing Winds from the east at 3 PM took a light breeze from the West bore too at day light found we had drifted to the east of the Cape 13 PM made sail strong gales and clear at 5 PM wind hauled at 1 PM at 9 PM tacked Cape bore bearing West bore headed us off a gain at 12 PM Bar 30-11 Lat 35-10 long Bar 30-03 falling 12 Miles 29-08 12 Miles 29-04

Wednesday April 5th 1843

there 24 hours strong and unsteady gales from the NW with some heavy squalls from the NW sail down to double reef made several tacks but the current so strong against us we made but little to windward Bar 29-05 at 12 Miles Cape bore bore 1 by W Lat 34-40 S

Thursday April 6th 1843

There 24 hours strong and unsteady breezes and fair weather Wind NW to WSW at 8 PM bore up and over to the North strong current against us Bar on 29-08 at 12 Miles
Lat 32-44 S long 175-18 E
