There 24 hours unsteady breeze from SE to NW
 fair weather all sail set most of the time Bar 30.01
 Lat 31-29 S Long 175-33 E Cos

Sunday April 9th 1843

There 24 hours fresh and unsteady breezes
 from NE middle and late part strong gales
 and squally from SE to SW with rain down
 Lat 31-28 S Long 179-²⁰ E Cos Bar 30.00

Monday April 10th 1843

There 24 hours strong gales from SE high
 under double and close reef Bar 30.00
 Lat 31-45 S Long 177-50 E Cos

Tuesday April 11th 1843

There 24 hours strong gales from SE high
 squally high sea under double reef all sail
 set Bar 30.00 Lat 31-45 S Long 177-50 E Cos

Wednesday April 12th 1843

There 24 hours lower fresh and unsteady
 and fair weather winds from SE to 14 S 8 bell
 Lat 31-26 S Long 177-00 E Cos

Thursday April 13th 1843

Commenced with strong landy at day light commenced
 raining until 11 till 11.00 S 10 till 11.00 till 11.00
 Lat 31-26 S Long 176-44 E Cos

Friday April 14th 1843

There 24 hours strong and unsteady winds and squally
 with showers headed to the south the 24 hours wind
 from SE to 14 Bar 29.08 Long 177-10 E Cos

Saturday April 15th 1843

There 24 hours begins with fresh and unsteady breeze
 and fair weather but part moderate at 10 S 11
 spoke the ship London Packet before saw
 Ketchikan Island at day light 12.00 Lat 31-04 S Long 175-57

Sunday April 16th 1843

There 24 hours winds fresh and unsteady
 made several times heat up in about 12 miles
 of Ketchikan at 12.00 Lat 31-04 S Long 175-50 E Cos

Monday April 17th 1843

There 24 hours light baffling air and calms
 heat up to Ketchikan went on shore 13.00
 but could get no regulables Bar 29.00

Tuesday April 18th 1843

There 24 hours moderate and baffling winds from
 NE to SE at 11.00 saw whales 40 SE of Ketchikan thick
 light winds and rainy lowered but the run of 2 boats
 bore a back about until 12.00 struck me
 and drove some few miles from shore Bar 29.00
