

Bark Mors in Pacific Ocean

Tuesday April 25th 1843

Commenced with a heavy gale thick and stormy
at 3 PM moderated sloped raining sea very
high middle and last part light hailing
suns and Calms Wind fins put it NW the bar
kept up first part 29.09 at 4 PM rose to 30
at 12 Mer Mc Carlies bore NE 1/2 E 18 miles
looked down to our Whale at day light got
him all in at 12 Mer

Wednesday April 26th 1843

Commenced with a calm high sea middle and
last part light breezes from the West to NE
and fair weather got the case cleared off bark
commenced boiling at 3 PM at 4 PM saw Whales
from the West head long way off going S
did not lower for them made sail at day
light headed up to NE at 12 Mer Mc Carlies
bore NE 1/2 E 15 miles at 10 PM 30.08

Thursday April 27th 1843

Here 24 begins light Winds from the
West ran down south of Mc Carlies side
saw the Curtis rocks at 6 PM have too
boiling at 8 PM took a heavy squall with
rain and light niry put out the fire
got our blubber below bared down bales
lay under Mast sail at 12 Mid night
cleared off day light got the fires going
boiled all out filled 62 bbls from Carles
last part strong breezes from the West
at 12 Mer Mc Carlies bore NE 20 miles
at 10 PM 30.15

Whaling & Brownell's Bark

Friday April 28th 1843

Commenced with strong gales and a heavy squall sent
down 100 gallons yards hoisted foretopgal new
deck load of Oil middle moderate last part SW
from NW to NW broke out to storm down at day light
at 8 AM saw Whales Richerches bearing NW got 10 miles
first lowered found them going faster to Windward
than we could pull can we board at 9 PM got all ready to
run Oil at 12 Mer Richerches bearing NW



Saturday April 29th 1843

Commenced strong breezes from NW fair weather
got a boat 40 bbls of Oil run before dark middle
calm high sea last part light Winds from the
West ran all down at 10 AM cleared to the north
at 12 Mer Richerches bore NW 10 miles at 10 PM
ran down 56 bbls

Sunday April 30th 1843

Commenced with hailing and unsteady winds
and squall at 5 PM have too in a squall
middle and last part fresh and unsteady winds
and hailing headed to the NE Wind NW 30 miles
at 10 PM 30.05 long 178-18 miles

Monday May 1st 1843

Commenced with fresh and unsteady breezes and
squally middle and last part strong gales
clear Winds from SE to S by W ran 20 miles at 2
saw a bark to South have too
at 30-28 S long 178 miles
