Thursday June 8th 1843

There 24 hours begins strong gale from ENE to East some heavy squalls under close reef for top sail double reef Main & sail at 6 P.M. took in fore top sail at 6 P.M. took in fore sail lay under close reef Main top try sails a hard gale had sea wave to the south at 10 P.M. kept on foreward tack rest of the day at Miller's Cove latitude 18° 51' Bar 30.01 Lat 41° 54' South

Friday June 9th 1843

There 24 hours begins strong gales from ENE under close reef all top sail try sails at 1 P.M. set fore top sail at 4 set fore sail turned on reef set all top sail at 10 were ship to NE at 11 took in fore top sail at day light were ship took in fore top sail at 8 set Main double reef jib Main at 9 took in jib spanker squally strong gales at 12 Mer's Cove latitude 18° 15' Bar 30.02 Lat 41° 14' South

Saturday June 10th 1843

There 24 hours begins strong gales and squalls took in all sail at 1 P.M. close reefed fore top sail double reefed Main at 4 P.M. took in fore sail violent squalls at 4 P.M. set fore sail but part unstayed Wind high sea set all sail jib and spanker turned out the reefs at 9 P.M. at 10 were to South Wind ENE to East at 12 Mer's Cove latitude 18° 15' Bar 30.03 Lat 41° 14' South Bar falling 12th 29.98

Pacific Ocean Whaling at Bonaville Beach

Sunday June 11th 1843

Bornenes with moderate breezes high sea fair weather Wind ENE headed to drift to 10 P.M. tucked to South got in on the NE end of Bonaville ^{18 P.M.} got the boat on shore to get 11th as we are out the last part light haphing winds from SE to East Bar 30.09

Monday June 12th 1843

Bornenes moderate breezes from the NE and clear high swell from the NE at 2 P.M. the boat came off with a load of Wood had hard work to get it as it was sandy middle and last part Calm had hard work to keep to South as there is a current to NE middle and last part Calm carried us at least 15 miles from land got the water cork on deck and bucketed to take on shore at 12 Mer's Cove latitude 18° 00' Bar 30.00

Tuesday June 13th 1843

Bornenes with light haphing airs and Calm Middle a moderate breeze from NE ran in for the land at day light started with a couple of leak turned them on shore filled them and got off a load of Wood but part Calm drifted to far off to turn the Water Bar 30.01

Wednesday June 14th 1843

There 24 hours mostly Calm with some light airs from the East got off 2 boat load of Wood in the afternoon but to far off to get off Water broke out our Bread and got cleared between Decks and crossed the Bread at 12 Mer's the center of the Island bore 18° 15' Bar 30.01
