

Bark Mars of New Bedford in the

Thursday June 15th 1843

there 24 hours Calm ship to far off  
to get any thing off but Wood got off  
3 loads stowed down the Breud between  
Decks after Coopering at 12 Private Bar 28  
Lat Ob 21-04 Long Bar 30-00

Friday June 16th 1843

Commences with a Calm middle and but  
put a light breeze from the East with 4 Whir  
marked the ship in got off 25 back of  
Water stowed them down let one with  
get on shore two men deserted caught them  
both and put Royal Goodenow in forms  
Lat Ob 21-11 Long Bar 30

Saturday June 17th 1843

Commences with light breezes from the North  
middle Calm but put strong gales from  
SE finished stowing down water and turned  
a raft on shore at night took near all the  
fine room to heat up so we could get on  
water off started on shore at 11 AM seized up  
Royal Goodenow and gave him on his  
at 12 Mer ship in close to reef Bar on 30

Sunday June 18th 1843

there 24 hours fresh and unsteady breezes  
from SE to south and fair weather at 1 PM got  
a raft of 22 backs of fresh water a long side  
at 2 PM got them all on deck took in sail to  
stow down got down but 4 back Bar 30 to 30-01  
Lat Ob 20-55 Long 159-56 Lat  
at 12 Mer Private bar South

Monday June 19th 1843

Commences strong breezes fair weather middle squally  
made several tacks to heat up to Proterge commenced  
stowing down water in the after hold sea had but put  
more moderate Winds from SE to South Bar 30 to 30-01  
at 12 Mer the Island bore 12 10 miles East

Tuesday June 20th 1843

Commences with fresh breezes and fair weather  
middle squally and strong but not quite moderate  
stowed down the Water heat up to the last end of  
Private at day light run down to the West end of  
the Island and went on shore found the landing bad  
and could get no Wood on a count of not having blue  
cloth could get no vegetables off on a count of this  
getting me Wood 18 Bar on 30 at 10 left off NW  
Lat Ob 21-05 Long Bar 160-23 W

Wednesday

Thursday June 21st 1843

have been running NW Wind SE and  
very unsteady all hands employed mending sail  
brought 2 men from Proterge and got clear of  
none as there is no consul Bar 29-09 to 30  
Lat Ob 19-04 Long 160-50 West End

Thursday June 22nd 1843

there 24 hours moderate and unsteady breezes  
from SE to South fair weather at 2 AM  
have too lay until day light stowed off Water  
all hands employed mending sails got a lead  
Wound with a sail needle in my hand sent  
the eye of a ropeing need to the home on  
the Palm of my hand Bar 30 to 29-09  
Lat Ob 17-24 Long 161-56 W End
