

Bank Mass of N Bedford

Saturday July 1st 1843

These 24 hours light winds from the East and clear weather run down on the South side of Toomahloah Bar 29-09
 Lat 0° 14' 20" Long 170° 08' 00"

Sunday July 2nd 1843

These 24 hours moderate trades from ESE to SE clear weather run down and made Toletovela at 11 AM but a lot of time too until day light at 7 AM went on shore with the boat and got off a load of gums

Monday July 3rd 1843

These 24 moderate and unsteady trades from ESE fair weather going off and on at Toletovela some time the first part of the 24 hours had Benjamin F. Burton Stephen Hill and Frederick O. Journal to Desert in some of the canoes went on shore in the morning and found they had no been any where that we landed heard that they had gone to another island to stand stand got off several boxes of gums, bananas and plantains

Tuesday July 4th 1843

These 24 hours moderate trades and fair weather at 6 AM hauled our line to see could have nothing from the Desert
 Lat 0° 13' 42" Long 170° 41' 00"

in Pacific Ocean Whaling A Brown

Wednesday July 5th 1843

These 24 hours a fine whale sail bore from ESE clear weather made several tacks and at 8 AM saw a Sperm Whale the master most of the weather ground of Toomahloah bearing 11 15 Miles but lowered the boats got far at 9 AM got him nearly dead at 12 AM no oil



Thursday July 6th 1843

These 24 hours begins moderate breezes from SE fair weather middle light bofing air and calms last part light winds from SE hauled two whale a long side at 11 AM took in sail and got ready to cut in at 3 PM got out the gear cut the lead part got a off corner of log light bore with in and got the case ready to bail at 12 AM at 12 AM Toletovela bore 17 Miles in Toomahloah at 1 PM No oil

Friday July 7th 1843

18 these 24 light breezes with calm from NW to SE last part at 11 AM hauled the case and commenced boiling at 6 AM boiled the rest of the 24 hours on the body at 12 AM Toomahloah bore 18 23 Miles SE Bar falling on 29 08

Saturday July 8th 1843

Commenced with light breezes from SE fair weather middle and last part fresh gales and clear boiling the 24 hours got all boiled out to a boat 15 lbs at 12 AM Toomahloah bore 18 20 Miles SE
