

Bank Stars of New Bedford

Sunday July 9th 1843

There 24 hours moderate and unsteady winds from South to SW finished boiling at 5 pm filled from the deck 90 bbls of
Toomahlook here 111 Bar 29.09
at 6 1/2 15-45

Monday July 10th 1843

There 24 hours unsteady breezes from the NW fair weather passed to the South of Toomahlook at 6 PM kept to the SW all night at day light backed to the West at 12 M. Took here 111 Bar 29.09
at 6 1/2 coopered the oil we had on board

Tuesday July 11th 1843

Commenced with moderate breezes from SW and fair weather middle light and hailing with a heavy storm at day break last part hot scalding sun with hailing winds and Calms at 4 PM finished coopers oil at day light broke out and commenced stowing down fore hold Bar 29.09
at 12 M. Took here 111 Bar 29.09

Wednesday July 12th 1843

Commenced with light hailing winds from the South to West some Calms middle the latter part light winds and Calms current to the storm all down got below 90 bbls got at noon at 5 PM filled gun one tier across the ship in lower hold square for hatching
at 14=06 Took here 111 Bar 29.09

in Pacific Ocean Whaling Abstract

Thursday July 13th 1843

Commenced with light hailing winds from the NW at 12 M. hauled to the last heavy storm from 4 to 10 PM set fair and clear at 12 M. Took here 111 Bar 29.09
at 6 1/2 15-45

Friday July 14th 1843

There 24 hours unsteady winds from SW and fair weather run in off Toomahlook and got a man a Native of Ketchikan passed through between the weathered side and Tanfoe to the South
Obs 14-18 1 long 170-13 low

Saturday July 15th 1843

There 24 hours moderate breezes from SW to SW fair weather run off to the West passed the Sa end of the Group hauled by the wind at 5 PM headed to the North at 6 PM kept off 2 hours hauled by the wind to South Bar 30.00
at 6 1/2 15-45 long 170-13 W. Co. Tanfoe 14 20 30

Sunday July 16th 1843

There 24 hours fresh trades and fair weather passed 15 miles to West Tanfoe side have too under short sail during the night at day light kept off to the West Wind S.W. at 10 PM saw 2 large sperm Whales going quick to Wind Ward one went out of sight the other kept along by the Wind made all sail and chased him the rest of the day Totevalat heavy with the oil and kept by the Wind to 10 PM after making one short tack.
