

Bank Mass of New Bedford in

Monday July 17th 1843

Commenced with unsteady Trades and some showers in chase of a Whale at 2:00 PM lowered the boat had 4 or 5 risings but could not get near enough as he went so much on a Wind the boat felt to lurch and with sails on gave up the chase at 5:00 PM headed by the Wind to drift all night under a day light and ran free the rest of the day to NW at 12 AM NW end of Toothilla bore WNW middle and last part best breeze Bar 29.09 & 30 Lat 44 14-17 Long 69 170-59

Tuesday July 18th 1843

There 24 hours begins strong trade at 4:00 AM heavy weather middle to last part blew strong run off NW under short sail passed a ship headed to NW at 12 AM South end of Toothilla bore NE by Lat 44 14-44 Long 69 170-44 Bar 29.09

Wednesday July 19th 1843

There 24 hours strong gales from 8:00 AM with some squalls and showers have been under close reef for top sail double reef chain with the jib and spanker the most part of the time passed to Lizard of Toothilla a boat 10 miles at 4 PM at 6 AM tacked to South fetched up with in 6 miles Lizard Racks run down to the West end of 12 miles the West end of Toothilla by 6:00 PM 170-10 Lat 44 14-16

Thursday July 20th 1843

There 24 hours strong gales and squally hauled to South round the East end of Toothilla headed to South until 1 PM more ship to NW Wind but to NW under double and close reef top sail ran a large Breach at 6:00 AM looked until 8:00 AM but blowing so strong could not find him run to NW from Capola 14-35 Bar 29.09

Friday July 21st 1843

Commenced with strong breezes and fair weather headed to the North under double and close reef middle and last part more moderate passed Capola at 6:00 AM more ship at day light and run off to NW at 12 AM East end of Capola bore NE by Lat 44 13-49 Long 69 170-51 Bar 29.09

Saturday July 22nd 1843

There 24 hours strong gales and clear could carry no more than double and close reef top sails by the Wind run down the North side of Capola hauled by the Wind & ran down run down next in with boat at the Lizard found the White Walkers of London 20 months out 1300 bbls. from St. Ives New London 20 lbs 200 sherrin 1400 Whale

Sunday July 23rd 1843

There 24 hours strong gales fair weather Wind at East to NW lying off and on of Capola on different tacks jib and spanker in the 24 hours

Lat 44 13-37 Long 172-02 Bar 29.09 the Center of Capola heavy rain
