

Bank Mass of New Bedford in
Monday July 24th 1843

There 24 hours fresh breeze from S.W. &
clear weather ran down off the Highlands
of Manona went in with the boat
sold 2 kegs of Tobacco and got a lot
of Slaps for the crew

Tuesday July 25th 1843

There 24 hours moderate from E. to
S.W. clear sea ran down to Samara
to the consuls and discharged George O's
with his consent traded for some Slaps

Wednesday July 26th 1843

There 24 hours light airs and from the
E. and clear could not get off last evening
until dark headed off to the ^{North} coast and
at day light headed to N.W. to pass between
Opola and Savoy at 12 Mer the small tide
bore N.W. 5 Miles S.W.

Lat. 13-44-1 Long 172-36 E

Thursday July 27th 1843

There 24 hours commences with
light breeze and calms at 3 P.M. took
a breeze from South between Opola and
Savoy ran to the North bore two all
night made sail to run down to the
N.W. end of Savoy at 4 A.M. saw a school
of Whales to the North 8 Miles from the
land at 9 commenced at 12 Mer had
3 dead and the boats in chase of more
a ship in sight from the east head
to Sea Mass

Friday July 28th 1843

Commences with fresh gales and fair weather
middle and last part blowing strong got
5 Whales did get them all a long side of
4 till lay by them all night broke
down at day light very rough got in
3 of them at 12 Mer Wind at South to N.W.
ran Opola bearing South 30 miles S.W.
No Obs

Saturday July 29th 1843

There 24 hours blowing strong Drizzle till 1 P.M.
had run got in the last 2 Whales after dinner
got all on back of 3 till cut off the side of on
deck them over board got the junks secured
and cleared up as well as we could the water breaking
over at 4 Mer turned all hands on at day light
cleared away the junks commenced hoisting on body
none ship at 5 till to south Bar on 30 to 40-9
Lat Obs 12-30 Long 173-00 to what in Opola South

Sunday July 30th 1843

There 24 hours begins with strong gales clear
weather at 5 A.M. more ship to N.W. at 7 was to
South Wind from N.W. to N. but part moderate
at fore top sail jib and stiver hoisting the
24 hours got the body all hoisted filled on deck 4 till
at 12 Mer the Sea end of Opola bore
South
