

Bank Mans of New Bedford in

Monday August 14th 1843

Commences with strong breezes and fair weather Wind ~~SE~~ East to SSE & 12 Miles more shift to NE at 4 AM were to South so jib and spanker double reef Main top sails close reef fore with courses set last part strong breezes made no more sail at 8 AM saw Breakers from the main head bearing N by W in half an hour saw Boscawens Island at 10 AM was up with the reef one mile to West of it bearing from Boscawens N 8° East Steered for the Island and bore the log 3 times and made 11 miles Obs in 15-38-1 making the lat of the reef 15-27-1 and by several sights of Gro made it 4 miles East of Boscawens Tides there appeared to be 2 shoals bearing from each other NW and SE 100 feet the western most one not in sight all the time but forming a heavy sea occasionally the latter most breaking heavy with the appearance of being near the tin water in smooth weather they may not break

Tuesday August 15th 1843

These 24 hours unsteady winds and fair weather from SE to SSE run into Boscawens some game one bag and in the morning went to Heppels Island began a trade for game got off one load

Wednesday August 16th 1843

These 24 hours fresh breezes and fair weather going off and on at Heppels Island got off got off 3 boat loads of game and other vegetables with some bags and fowl Wind from East to SSE

Thursday August 17th 1843

These 24 hours moderate breezes and fair weather Wind from NE to ESE got the last boat load of vegetables off at 6 AM headed to the South all night at 5 AM tacked to North continued the rest of the day Lat Obs 16-15 Heppels heavy NW gale

Friday August 18th 1843

These 24 hours begins with light breezes from East to NE at 6 AM tacked to N middle to last part light airs and Calms very hot sun about 50 miles East of Heppels Dred Sed Obs 16-37-1 Bar 29-09 to 29

Saturday August 19th 1843

These 24 hours light fleeting airs from South to West with some showers but the most clear with Calms Bar 29-9 to 29 Lat Obs 16-42-1 Log 143-21 Water 6-5

Sunday August 20th 1843

These 24 hours begins with light breezes and Calms middle and last part light breezes from NE to SE clear weather at 4 AM ran a fowl of some thing so as to give the vessel all one and make the people up below very much steady Lat Obs 16-24-1 Log 172-34 6 for 24
