

Bark Mars of New Bedford in
Monday August 21st 1843

There 24 hours moderate and baffling
Winds from ENE to NNW with some showers
Lat 15-51 N Long 170-33 W Bar 29.97 & 30

Tuesday August 22nd 1843

There 24 hours baffling and
unsteady Winds with showers but
moderate and light the most part from
ENE to South Bar 30

Lat 15-22 N Long 170-40 W

Wednesday August 23rd 1843

There 24 hours baffling and unsteady
Winds with some calms of short duration
Winds baffling from NE to South some heavy
showers of rain & 12 Mer son Toomalook
bearing NW 30 miles Lat 16-06

Thursday August 24th 1843

There 24 hours baffling Winds from
NE to South squally stormy & 12 Mer
Toomalook bore North

Lat 16-14 N Long 171-00 W

Friday August 25th 1843

There 24 hours moderate baffling Winds
from East to South With calms passed in
between Toomalook and the small Isle
& dark went on shore at 11 AM returned
at 3 to rigged to get off Wood hauled
to North & 6 AM kept off West Lat 16-14-06
Long 170-30 W 30 miles to be to the
West for these Islands here the same as
2 months ago

Pacific Ocean Whaling A Brownell's Bark

Saturday August 26th 1843

There 24 hours light baffling Winds from East
to South with fair weather run down to Totaveila
from the Weather Islands & 12 Mer the East end
bore NE Obs in Lat 14-15 N Long 171-30 W

Sunday August 27th 1843

There 24 hours begins with light breezes and
fair weather at 6 AM tacked to NE and
with the same middle strong gales and squally
& 2 AM set in thick and stormy heavy showers
of rain continued the rest of the day had sea
& 10 AM were ship to North Wind at East 6 miles
from the small Isle to Eward of Totaveila bearing
NW from us Wind NE to NE Bar 29-09 no indication
of Bad Weather no obs

Monday August 28th 1843

There 24 hours baffling and unsteady
Winds from NE to NE with squally heavy
showers and calms tacked several times
off Totaveila & 12 Mer the Coxcomb
rocks bore NW 6 miles Lat

Tuesday August 29th 1843

There 24 hours light baffling air from
the North and West with calms got up our
water cask and heaved them up
& 12 Mer 8 miles NW of the NE point
of Totaveila

Wednesday August 30th 1843

There 24 hours Calms with some light air
from NW to NW off Totaveila cask all ready
to go a watering but cannot get in with the
same 2 men George Smith John Corral
