

Bank Mars of New Bedford

Thursday Nov 2nd 1843

Commences Commences with fresh gales from NW
tacked to the West lay under short sail during
the night made sail to NW Wind WSW Reckered
bearing NW and 2 Bank to the NW of us
at last part strong gales nipped parted the
front rope of the fore top sail split the
sail rent and bent another Bar 30
Lat Obs 29-23 Long 178-50 Cor to far
to the West by 82 mile Reckered bore NW

Friday Nov 3th 1843

There 24 hours a gale from NW at 4 AM
run under the lee of Reckered and kept
on in the night the Cor of N Bedford and
a Sidney Bank did not speak her the Cor
has 330 bbls 1 sperm Oil 26 Mc Oil Landed
to the south during the night at 4 AM went
to NW and got under the land the other 2 blms
off Lat Obs 29-11 under the lee Bar 30

Saturday Nov 4th 1843

There 24 hours strong and unsteady breezes
from NW fair weather kept under the
lee of Reckered sent the boat and got
a fine mess of fish headed to the south
tacked to North at 2 AM wind hauled against
us could not fetch the Island by 7 or 8 mile
Obs Lat 29-01 Long Bar 30

Sunday Nov 5th 1843

Commences with strong breeze equally middle
moderate cloudy but part moderate clear Wind
hauled from NW to NW came to the East of
Reckered at 9 AM 6 miles out Corak and one English in
sight Lat 29-16 Long 177-30 End Bar 30-1

in the Pacific Ocean Whaling & Brownell

Monday Nov 6th 1843

Commences with moderate breezes from South fair
weather middle and last part hazy and calm
we have been to the East of Reckered trying to get South
I have been suffering with the yue in my head rheumatic
8c not far from the Isl Bar 30-1

Tuesday Nov 7th 1843

There 24 hours calm about 12 miles East of the
Isle hauled on for Black fish did not get on some
suffering with a stiff neck shoulder but gaining on it
Lat Obs 29-15 Long 177 Bar 30-014

Wednesday Nov 8th 1843

Commences with a calm had a light breeze at 8 AM clear
lasted the 24 hours from North to NW at 10 AM the Mc Carles
Isle bore NW 3/4 steering N 1/2 W I have been obliged to sit
up all last night for the moment that I lay down so
much pain in the head and shoulder could not sleep
Lat Obs 29-58 Reckered bearing North Bar on 31

Thursday Nov 9th 1843

There 24 hours light airs from NW to NW
and clear weather run down for the Carles Isle
have too headed to the East at 6 AM had a current
to the SE during the night made all sail to the
West at 12 AM the Curtis Rocks bore NW 15 miles
Lat Obs 30-30 Long 178-07 W Cor Bar on 30

Friday Nov 10th 1843

There 24 hours some light airs from NW
but the most part calm lying near the
Curtis rocks to the East of them sent in the boat
caught a haul one box fish
Lat Obs 30-33 Long 178-16 Cor Bar 30-01
