

Banks Mass of New Bedford in
Saturday Nov 11th 1843

Commenced with a light air from NNE & S. Calm at 7 AM took a light breeze from the North headed out unto the N. at 9 AM spoke the Bright Planet of Sydney 8 months out 160 kbls & 12 Miller Mc caulies here WNW 15 kbls
Lat Obs 30 21 1 Bar 30

Sunday Nov 12th 1843

There 24 hours light breezes from the North and fair weather at 9 AM hauled to the south of Mc Caulies Island made several tacks to lay Ward of it at 6 PM sent 2 boats on shore to get goats and Hogs lay with light air the rest of the day clear in with the east side of the Isle Lat 30 17 1 Bar 29.07

Monday Nov 13th 1843

There 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from West fair weather at 5 PM the boats came off with 3 dead and 4 live goats and a boat 30 small pigs and sheats headed to the east light winds and cloudy passed a vessel at 3 PM headed to the West from 4 to 6 showing but fair weather Lat 30-22 Bar 28.1

Tuesday Nov 14th 1843

Commenced with moderate huffling winds from the North with Calm at 10 AM took a breeze from South that lasted the rest of the day steered off N for Richerches & saw the land bearing WNW Bar rise 29.09

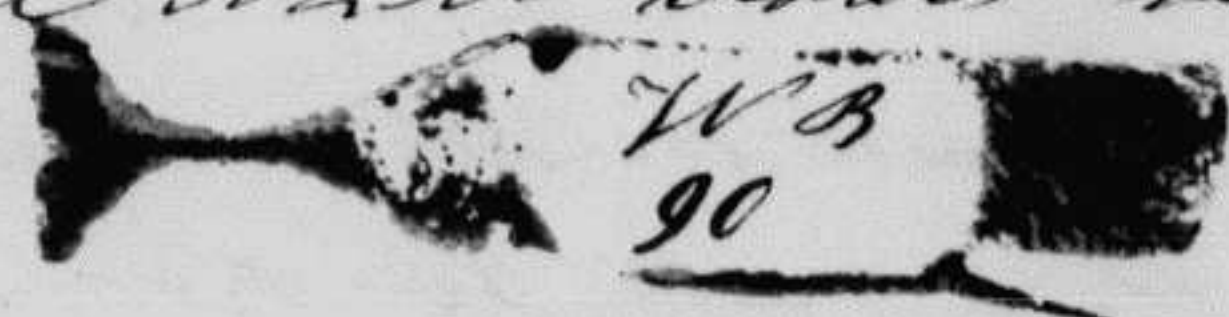

Wednesday Nov 15th 1843

There 24 hours begins light breeze from South at 4 PM hauled to the East off the South side of Richerches middle Calm out to the N. at 1 PM light breeze from NNE with Calm Bar 30.01
Lat Obs 29 17 1 Long 177 31 W. S. by Lumber 177-33

Thursday Nov 16th 1843

There 24 hours light huffling air from the North and the West with clear weather lay for the part off the east end of Richerches with a great share of Calm at 4 PM saw 2 sperm Whales lowered at 8 Calm going to the North a boat got in with the landward boat missed him chased the rest of the day headed the ship to the North boats nearly out of sight no Obs



Friday Nov 17th 1843

There 24 hours light huffling air from the North and West with calm the boats in chase of Whales at 2 PM got on with the West boat out of sight of the ship got near him along side at 5 PM had a moderate breeze for a boat 3 hours hooked down at day light got the head off and jam in and huffed in to one piece at 12 Miller nearly Island rose 1 PM a boat 3000 Dint a Ship in sight
