

Bank Man of New Bedford in

Saturday Nov 18th 1843

Commences with moderate breezes from the S. W. to South middle to last part light huffing airs and variable took in the junk and hauled the Case cleared up and commenced hauling head at 8 AM & sail in sight at 12 Mer Reckonches bar S.W. 1/2 S 30 miles but made all sail & at day light to the NW Bar on 30-01

Sunday Nov 19th 1843

These 24 hours light huffing airs from the South and clear weather have been a hauling the 24 hours one sail in sight at 12 Mer Reckonches bar S.W. 1/2 S 30 miles

Monday Nov 20th

Commences with moderate breezes from the N. fair weather at 3 AM spoke the ship Leonidas Nye of New Bedford 22 Masts on 250 lbs finished hauling at 10 AM passed on to the south of Peckholes middle and last cloudy Wind at 11 AM the last part breezes turned on to huffing at 5 AM at 9 AM tacked 8 Mts to the N. of Reckonches tender to 241 N. E. Bar 29-08

Tuesday Nov 21st 1843

Commences with fresh and lively Wind from the N. E. South most part middle to last part strong breezes from East to S. E. at day light broke out the fine peak and began to stow down all at 12 Mer Reckonches bar S.W. 1/2 S 30 miles

Wednesday & Nov 22nd 1843

These 24 hours begins with strong gales from the N. E. quickly home too stowing down at 4 AM stowed all down 92 lbs middle quickly Wind hauled to the North under light wing lying under close reef at 11 AM sail at 3 AM a violent heavy squall last part wind variable with heavy squalls thunder and light from N.W. to South made sail at 9 AM had to take in at 11 the bar at 29-05 at 12 Mer a low at 8 PM as 29-04 No Ob. Reckonches bar N.W. 30 miles

Thursday Nov 23rd 1843

Commences with heavy squalls from the N. E. to N.W. lying under all till sail fine sail at 9 AM have too under close reef at 11 AM sail try sails middle and last part strong gale high sea and clear except a few squalls at 6 AM took in West boat at 11 29-03 & heavy 177-05 Bar. vis bar 29-04 to 06

Friday Nov 24th 1843

Commences with a strong gales from N. E. and fair weather middle moderate sea had last part light Winds from N.W. to N. E. had Bar vis from 29-06 to 30 Sat 11 29-08 & heavy 177-340 Bar

Saturday Nov 25th 1843

Commences with a calm middle at 3 AM took a breeze from the East that lasted the rest of the rest of the day at 8 AM started to go on shore at Reckonches to get vegetables have too to Wind Ward of the bay strong current setting to Windward
