

Bark Stars of New Bedford

Monday June the 10th 1844

These 24 hours light baffling airs from the N. strong current to NW Bar 30-03
Lat Obs 28-32.1 by 160-40.0 Long 160-25

Tuesday June 11th 1844

These 24 hours light ~~the~~ airs between NW and NNW with some Calms headed to the South and Lat 28-54.1 by 160-23 Long Bar 30-00 fully

Wednesday June 12th 1844

These 24 hours begins with light airs and heavy baffling from NW to Lat headed to S. middle and Lat unsteady breezes and Land Wind from N to NW Bar falling 29-09
Lat by Obs 29-34 nearly the truth

Thursday June 13th 1844

These 24 hours with thick cloudy weather Wind from SW to NW under double reefs at 6 AM took in all sail jib rain pouring down in torrents so took in fore top sail close reefed main Wind at NW at 12 Mid out West Bar down 29-06 at 8 AM took out 11 AM in a squall bore too took in fore sail but put back away strong gale by 2.00
Lat Obs 28-46.1 by 163-20.0

Friday June 14th 1844

These 24 hours begins with a gale at 11 AM at 6 AM set fore sail fore top sail at 6 AM set all sail mistle and Lat part strong and unsteady Winds squally but not moderating first rain hours and sunshine Bar rising at 12 AM up to 30-00
Lat Obs 29-19.1 by 164-46.0

Saturday June 15th 1844

Comences with fresh and unsteady breezes middle and Lat part light baffling Winds and Calms over cast Wind from S. S. to South headed 3 hours to South Lat by Obs not to be depended on 29-19.1 by Bar up to 30-01

Sunday June 16th 1844

Comences with light baffling Winds from the N varying 4 or 5 points some but Calm at 4 AM saw a Hump Whale 2 miles off study but not thick had 70 minutes day light did not see him again middle fresh and unsteady made a tack of 6 hours to the South at 8 AM saw Norfolk Island heavy SW by Compass the sun was eclipsed had heavy squalls reeled down Wind from S. S. to South no Obs Bar 30-02
Lat by 29-13 by 168-30

Monday June 17th 1844

Comences with very unsteady Winds squally with showers reeled several times ran for Norfolk Island as near as we could by the Wind passed to the North of it at 6 AM sailed off had fresh and unsteady breezes the rest of the 24 hours clear weather Bar 30-02 at 12 AM N Island bore NW by Compass Lat Obs 28-33.1 Long 164-46.0

Tuesday June 18th 1844

These 24 hours unsteady Winds from SW baffling with some squalls and showers but sight of Norfolk Is. at 2 PM the most part clear and cold for the latitude Bar barometer by 30-02
Lat Obs 28-10.1 by 170-15.0
