

Bark Mars in the Pacific

Wednesday June 19th 1844

Commences with light breezes from the SE middle and last part so hupling from middle to NW Bar rose
Lat Obs 28-22.1 by 171-44.8 Eros

Thursday June 20th 1844

Commences with light breezes from NW fair weather middle fresh breezes weather fair last part strong breezes cloudy Wind from West still observation Lat about 29 Bar fell 29.09

Friday June 21st 1844

These 24 hours begins with thick and stormy weather Wind N.W. to N.E. middle very strong breezes rainy & still shelter to the land but shortly left us in a calm & still took light breeze from NW labled the rest of the 24 hours Bar rose 29.09
Lat Obs 29-02.1 by 175-40 Eros

Saturday June 22nd 1844

Commences with a light air from West at a calm & still took a breeze from NW middle and last part the most of the time thick and rainy middle very unsteady Bar 29-03 carried M said
Lat Obs 29-15.1 by 174-23 E. Eros

Sunday June 23rd 1844

Commences with moderate breezes sun light stormy middle squally last part Wind hauled from West and N.W. to N.W. fair day weather Winds moderate ran to the east the 24 hours Bar rose 29.09
Lat Obs 29-32 by 179-29 E. Eros

Monday June 24th 1844

Commences with moderate and unsteady breezes from NW to NW fair weather last part fresh and squally I still saw Reckards 7th bearing N by compass & 12.00 here N.E. Bar 29-03
Lat Obs 29-33.1 by 175-17 West Eros

Tuesday June 25th 1844

These 24 hours begins squally weather middle and last part moderate and clear from NW to NW last part West to NW
Lat Obs 28-22.1 by 176-37 West Eros Bar rose up to 30
passed South of Reckards ^{run off} ~~passed~~ of N. by 176-37

Wednesday June 26th 1844

Commences with light breezes and clear middle & last part calm Winds from N.E. to NW Bar 30
Lat Obs 27-24.1 by 176-00 West Eros

Thursday June 27th 1844

These 24 hours begins calm & still got a breeze from the North & it tacked to the ^{East} at 6 AM tacked to the West & continued in the barboard tack the rest of the day & hoiled over the pickle in 5 Tierces of Beef making 22 out of 30 and put in more salt Bar 29-09 & 10
Lat Obs 27-04.1 by 176-12 West Eros

Friday June 28th 1844

These 24 hours moderate breezes from NW the ship alone hauled by the Wind to NW Bar 29-09 & 10
Lat Obs 26-16.1 by 174-50 West Eros

Saturday June 29th 1844

Commences with light air from NW to NW middle and last part hupling variable but most of from the North with calms squally and showers
