Remarks ~~Saturday~~ July 12th 1844

There 24 hours moderate breezes and unsettled some light showers Wind from NE to ESE headed to the North at 8 AM tacked to SSE fetched up to the second Island of the weather Navigation obs
Obs Lat 14-09

Remarks Saturday July 13th 1844

Commenced with light Wind from NE for weather at 2 AM went on shore to a small Island to the seaward of Toomalavak and got off 21 small Piglet latter part of the night a heavy squall the rain pouring down until daylight kept off to the West NW at daylight & day at 12 AM Toteilla bore West and the full
Lat Obs 14-13 1 kg 172-07 Eves

Sunday July 14th 1844

There 24 hours variable and unsteady Winds with squalls but between the Wind NE at 6 PM bore two off the East end of Toteilla at 2 AM steered to the West at 8 AM Opola bearing NE at 12 AM bore W 10 miles bore
Lat Obs 14-00

Saturday July 27th

went in on the 15th current on 27th at Opola Coopered the Oil in the Main hatchway had lost 13 bbls and then the staves was broken at 11 AM got under way and run out at 12 AM was in Co with the Ship Company of Nantucket

in the Pacific Ocean Whaling & Commerce

Sunday July 18th 1844

Commenced with light breeze middle forenoon run down to the East end of Navy headed to the West Wind NE at 4 PM tacked off the East end of Opola at 12 AM Lat 13-55 by 10-10 bore

Monday July 29th 1844

There 24 hours begins moderate breezes from East middle baffling stormy but small breeze
Lat Obs 13-31 Opola East end

Tuesday July 30th 1844

There 24 hours some light air from the East but the most part calm with clear weather except a shower & dry breeze at 12 AM the West end of Opola bore NE Lat 13-38

Wednesday July 31st 1844

There 24 hours light baffling airs and calms at 6 AM kept off to our round. saw Opola bearing South at 10 AM saw white water from West head bearing NE of the stern for it until 12 AM very much Wind
Lat Obs 13-46

Thursday August 1st 1844

Commenced with light airs from the East at 12-30 PM sent off all the boats at 5 PM eight of them got up with a school of Whale & must strike to the West boat got him and stove the boat slightly at 9 squally Wind unsteady at 9 AM the light from the boats at 12 AM got the Whale along side but part strong gales heavy rain & 9 PM fished down 11.1 AM got him in Lat Obs 13-25 A. S. S. 15 AM
