Tuesday Sept 3rd 1844

There 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from SE cloudy some sun in middle light but for a fine moderate breeze from South and Clear headed to the East the 24th
Lat Obs 21-09 1 long 172-09 W Cor

Wednesday Sept 4th 1844

There 24 hours moderate and unsteady breezes from SE mostly overcast weather
6 bell tacked to NW carried it out during night had had sea from NW made but little progress with a foul and dull vessel and a current to NW
Lat Obs 21-17 1 long 172-30 W Cor

Thursday Sept 5th 1844

There 24 hours fresh and unsteady winds from SE to SE fair weather headed and running to the NW the 24 hours
Lat Obs in 22-29 1 long 173-54 W Cor

Friday Sept 6th 1844

There 24 hours strong breezes from SE to SE headed to South the 24 hours saw a bark to Wind Word under short sail and a sail to go off to distinguish light and confused sea
Lat Obs 23-42 1 long 173-58 W Cor

Saturday Sept 7th 1844

Commenced with strong breezes from SE squally middle shifted out to the West with heavy showers of rain in different tacks and various courses last part hupling air and Calms Bar 29.08 at 90
Lat Obs 23-44 1 long 173-28 W Cor

Sunday Sept 8th 1844

Commenced with light hupling air from NW fair weather headed to the SE middle moderate breezes from South have too of day light, steered NW fine breeze from SE clear weather
Lat Obs 23-32 1 long 173-04 W Cor

Monday Sept 9th 1844

There 24 hours strong breezes and squally light swell from SE Wind SE to SE in different tacks and running for part of the time saw several Hump Backs Bar has ranged on about 30
Lat Obs 22-41 1 long 173-07 W Cor

Tuesday Sept 10th 1844

There 24 hours strong breezes from SE fair weather steered off NW until 6 PM hauled to the Wind to the SE last part over North Bar up to 30 and above
Lat Obs 21-58 1 long 173-28 W Cor
