There 24 hours strong breezes from East to SE cloudy but no rain sun North at 6 AM bore too hot part on off NW

Bar on a bar 30 at 30-01

Thursday Sept 12th 1844

There 24 hours strong breezes from the East cloudy squally weather on dependent tacks bore too during the night

N O Obs to depend on

Friday Sept 13th 1844

Commences with strong breezes squally at 2 AM a gale strong bore too under line ^{net} Main top sail fore top sail continued blowing and stormy from ENE to ESE at 12 AM moderate bore too

fresh gales and stormy headed to South from 29-00-00
Lat Obs 22-52 1 long 174-55 Geo

Saturday Sept 14th 1844

Commences with fresh gales from ESE squally middle do bore too part light breezes from all on dependent tacks bar 29-09 at 30

Lat Obs 22-37 1 long 175-19 W Geo

Sunday Sept 15th 1844

There 24 hours begins with light Wind from NE over to NW at 4 AM ran Pilot's State being that middle huffing squally with calm bore too moderate breeze from NE to NW

Lat Obs 22-23 1 long 175-05 Geo

Monday Sept 16th 1844

There 24 begins with moderate breezes from NE fair weather middle uneasy some stormy bore too part strong breezes from NE fair weather

Lat Obs 22-21 1 long 174-04 W Geo

Tuesday Sept 17th 1844

There 24 hours fresh gales from NE to middle and some squally headed to be too the 24 hours run a number of blimp tacks

Lat Obs 21-45 1 long 173-02 Geo West

Wednesday Sept 18th 1844

There 24 hours strong gales under double and fore reef top sails the mast part with out jib on Mopker at 10 AM took in the sheet at 6 AM were shift to South Wind NE to NW

Lat Obs 21-54 1 long 172-39 Geo

Thursday Sept 19th 1844

Commences with strong gales from NE to NW headed to NW at 3 AM bore too under line reef all top sail and top sails blowing to heavy for Whaling at day light made sail close reef Wind SE clear with a few short squalls

Bar rising part up to 30-02

Lat Obs 22-22 1 long 173-37 Geo
