

Log Book of Ship North of Fair Haven on a

Whole Voyage to the South Atlantic Ocean 1836

Remarks on Monday 18th July 1836
Commenced with squalls from the S.W. and fair weather steering S.W. by E. a Brig in sight of Lord's Head
Sailing to the S.W. Middle and latter part very light
air from the S.W. all sail set steering S.W. by E. a Brig in sight
of Starboard Quarter running to the S.E. so ends there being
in play at ship's head
Obs Lat 39° 45' Long 67° 45' Chron 33.54 W
13 days out

Remarks on Friday 22nd July 1836
Commenced with light air from the W. and fair weather
steering to the S.W. a Brig in sight of Lord's Head
Sailing to the S.W. Middle and latter part very light
air from the S.W. all sail set steering S.W. by E. a Brig in sight
of Starboard Quarter running to the S.E. so ends there being
in play at ship's head
Obs Lat 39° 45' Long 67° 45' Chron 33.54 W
13 days out

Remarks on Tuesday 19th July 1836
Commenced with heavy gales from the S.W. and a very
bad sea being for head to the S.E. at 8 P.M. spoke the ship
Superior of Baltimore steering S.W. by E. under a close reefed top
at 10 P.M. left off S.W. by E. and with a close reefed top sail
at 11 P.M. more moderate turned out reefed top sail
at 12 P.M. spoke a ship bound to the N.W. at 1 P.M. saw
a ship off her beam which in the forenoon was
with strong wind from the Westward
Obs Lat 39° 45' Long 67° 45' Chron 33.54 W
14 days out

Remarks on Saturday 23rd July 1836
Drove light air from the S.W. and fair weather
steering to the S.W. a Brig in sight of Lord's Head
Sailing to the S.W. Middle and latter part very light
air from the S.W. all sail set steering S.W. by E. a Brig in sight
of Starboard Quarter running to the S.E. so ends there being
in play at ship's head
Obs Lat 39° 45' Long 67° 45' Chron 33.54 W
15 days out

Remarks on Wednesday 20th July 1836
Commenced with strong breezes from the Westward
and strong cloudy steering S.W. by E. a Brig in sight of
Lord's Head Middle and latter part squally took in
top galesails and reefed top sails latter part fine sea
from the Westward and fair weather set top galesails
and standing sail steered S.W. by E. two men sent
off deadweight
Obs Lat 39° 45' Long 67° 45' Chron 33.54 W
15 days out

Remarks on Sunday 24th July 1836
These 24 hours commences with fine breezes from the Southward
and fair weather all sail set by the wind to the Eastward
Middle and latter part the same at 1 P.M. spoke ship running
of N. Bedford ready out three black fish ship Liverpool in
sight a storm so ends with fine breezes from the S.W.
Obs Lat 39° 45' Long 67° 45' Chron 33.54 W
16 days out

Remarks on Thursday 21st July 1836
These 24 hours commences with fine breezes from the Westward
and fair weather steering S.W. by E. with all sail out at 3 P.M.
spoke a sail ahead steering to the S.W. Middle and latter part
light air from the Westward and fair weather all hands in play
steering up rigging &c. a Brig which was a head is now in
the forenoon seen so ends this 24 hours steering S.W. by E.
Obs Lat 39° 45' Long 67° 45' Chron 33.54 W
17 days out

Remarks on Monday 25th July 1836
Commenced with fine breezes from the S.W. and fair weather
steering S.W. by E. a Brig in sight of Lord's Head
Sailing to the S.W. Middle and latter part fine breezes
from the S.W. spoke Minerva of Liverpool in sight and
took S.W. by E. sail so ends with fine breezes and fair weather
all sail set steering S.W. by E. a Brig in sight
Obs Lat 39° 45' Long 67° 45' Chron 33.54 W
18 days out
