

Ship Martha Log Book On A Whaling Voyage to the S. Atlantic  
Remarks on Wednesday 3<sup>d</sup> August 1834.

Pleasant breeze from the East and fair weather  
Steering S by E with all sail set to the best advantage  
Middle and latter part the same all sail set steering  
S by E with all sail employed at Ship's duty.

Lat 11° 35' N. Long 22° 35' W.

29 days out  
Remarks on Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> August

Commenced with fine breeze from the  
N.E. and fair weather steering S by E by Compass  
Middle and latter part the same all hands employed  
fishing new boats &c. so ends with all sail set steering  
South.

Lat 11° 35' N. Long 22° 35' W.

30 days out  
Remarks on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> August 1834

Fine breeze from N.E. and passing clouds  
steering South by Compass with all sail set to the best  
advantage. Middle and latter part the same all employed  
so ends with fine breeze N.E. heads, steering S by E with all  
sail set to the best advantage.

31 days out  
Remarks on Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> August 1834

Fine N.E. heads steering S by E with all sail set to the  
best advantage. Middle and latter part the same  
so ends steering South by Compass employed fishing  
the new boats &c.

Lat 11° 35' N. Long 22° 35' W.

Ship Charles Fisher Master A.D. 1834

Remarks on Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> August 1834.

Came with fine breeze from the Eastward and cloudy, all sail  
set to the best advantage, steering South by Compass  
Middle and latter part wind ruffled from N.E. to E.S.E.  
Haul and took in sail evening this ends Sunday 7<sup>th</sup>.

Lat 11° 35' N. Long 22° 35' W.

32 days out  
Remarks on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> August 1834

These 24 hours commenced with wind from the East and  
cloudy steering South by Compass  
Middle part equally at 12 M. night the wind hauled to  
the S.W. heads rounded to the S.E. latter part Calm.  
So ends these 24 hours employed at Landing & S.C.

Lat 11° 35' N.

33 days out  
Remarks on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> August 1834

Calm and sea very rough ship making  
little or no way through the water.  
Middle and latter part light variable wind with squalls  
of rain at night steering to the Southward  
so ends this 24 hours with squalls and rain.

34 days out  
Remarks on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> August 1834

Squally wind from the East to S.E. by the end to  
the South. Middle and latter part Calm ship going  
round ground so ends with three sail in sight  
two of them being Bracadello sails.

Lat 11° 35' N.
