Remarks entered Thursday 11th August 1836

Commenced with Calm, gusts for top sail
& main top gale sail & best crew, three sail in
sight, Middle and latter part squally with thick
and lightened with variable rain wind all round
the compass at 4 P.M. it lighted up seen three
sail bearing to the South no other day

36 Days out

Remarks on Friday 12th August

Generally weather calm with plenty of
rain at 10 P.M. for top gale sail, long gale
from that side, reefed main top sail
Middle part Calm at 1 P.M. wind from the S.W. and squally
latter part the same all miscreant sail set by the wind
one sail in sight at 5 P.M. the 2nd day
Comes to sight 8 off duty, Lat. 9. 39 N Long 66. 12 W

37 Days out

Remarks on Saturday 13th August 1836

Calm with fine breeze from the S.W. and somewhat
squally, all sail set by the wind to the S.E.
Middle part wind hauled to the Westward & steered South
at 4 P.M. wind hauled back to the S.S.W. and squally, & ends by
the wind to the S.E. fresh breeze and clouds
one man sick 8 off duty, No other this day

38 Days out

Remarks on Sunday 14th August 1836

Comes with fresh breezes from the South and Cloud
by the wind to the S.E. one sail in sight a head
Middle and latter part the same ends with fine
breezes from the South two sail in sight

39 Days out

South Atlantic Ocean, Charles Fisher Master, 1836
Remarks entered Monday 15th August 1836

All these 24 hours moderate breezes from the S.W. and fair weather
by the wind to the S.E. two sail in sight at 1 P.M. the 1st
fox and main riggers so 1. 49

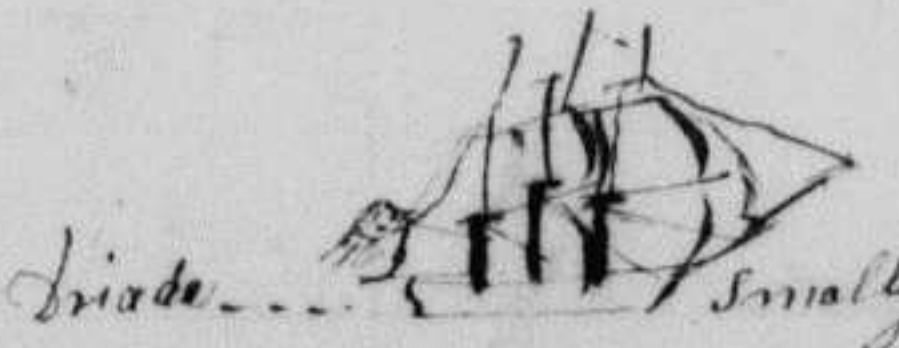

40 Days out

Remarks on Tuesday 16th August 1836

Moderate breezes from the S.W. and fair weather at 3 P.M.
speake Bark visible of Reg. 8. 10. 40 days out in sight
Middle and latter part fine breezes from the S.W. by the wind
to the S.E. in sight, sailing, same sea, riggers so
so ends all sail set by the wind two sail in sight
two men sick 8 off duty

Lat 8. 15 N Long 19. 23 W



41 Days out

Remarks on Wednesday 17th August 1836

Comes with fresh breezes from the S.W. and
cloudy, all sail set by the wind to the S.E. two sail
in sight, Middle and latter part the same all hands busy
in repair at 1 P.M. so ends with fresh breezes from
the S.W. by the wind to the S.E.

Lat 8. 04 Long by Chron 19. 37 W

42 Days out

Remarks on Thursday 18th August 1836

Fresh breezes from the S.W. by the wind to the S.E.
two sail in sight, Middle and latter part much
the same at 4 P.M. hauled to the Westward so ends with
fine breezes from the South by the wind to the S.W.
sail in sight
