the N.W. at 3 P.M. spoke the ship, Mechanic at 8 P.M.
no oil Middle and latter part the same as on the 20th
moderate breeze from the south by the wind to the N.W.
Ship, Mechanic in Co.

All these 24 hours pleasant breeze from the South to N.E. and
fair weather by the wind to the S.W. employed a Turnkey &c. on
the ship, Mechanic in sight a head so ends with all sail
set by the wind to the South one man sick & off
duty

To the S. Atlantic Ocean, Charles Fisher Master. 1836

Remarks entered Tuesday 20th August 1836

Fine breeze from S.E. and passing clouds all sail
set by the wind to the S.W.
Middle and latter part the same as on the 19th heard to the
S.W. employed painting new boots &c. one man sick &
off duty

Obs. Lat. 2. 43 S Long. by Chron 24. 03 W

Remarks on Wednesday 24th August 1836

South trades and fair weather all sail set by the wind to the
S.W. Middle and latter part the same as on the 23rd by the
wind heading from S.W. to N.W. employed a Turnkey &c.
one man sick & off duty

Obs. Latitude 4. 51 S Long. by Chron

Remarks on Thursday 25th August 1836

Pleasant breeze from S.E. and passing clouds all sail
set by the wind to the S.W. at 3 P.M. passed a ship
showing American Colours having before the wind
Middle and latter part the same as on the 24th the wind
to the S.W. employed, one man sick & off duty

Lat. 16. 0. 28 S Long. by Chron 25. 58 W

Remarks on Friday 26th August 1836

These 24 hours commenced with fine breeze from S.E. and
passing clouds all sail set by the wind to the Southward
Middle and latter part the same as on the 25th by the wind
to the Southward hands employed as usual
Bent a new part of mast & top sail
