Remarks entered Saturday 2^d August 1836

Fine breeze all sail set by the wind to the Southward.
Middle part the same.
Latter part fresh breezes and somewhat squally.
So ends with all sail by the wind, one man sick & off
Sandy.

Obs. Lat. 11.22 S. Long by Chron. 27.11 W.

30 Days out

Remarks on Sunday 2^d August 1836

Came with fine breeze from the S.E. by the wind to
the Southward at 2.10. raised a sail a head.
Middle and latter part much the same at 2.10. the
wind to the South a ship in sight on the weather beam.

Lat. Obs. 13.07 S. Long. 27.04 W

31 Days out

Remarks on Monday 2^d August 1836

Fine breeze from the S.E. all sail set by the wind
to the Southward. Middle and latter part much the
same all sail set by the wind to the South so ends with
fine breeze from the S.E. bearing S.E.

Lat. Obs. 14.30 S. Long. 28.11 W by Chron.

32 Days out

Remarks on Tuesday 3^d August 1836

Fine breeze from the East again steering
S.E. at 4.10. all sail set by the wind to the
Southward. Middle and latter part the same in
breeze out between decks as a falling the
Blaker now so ends with all sail in sight.

Lat. Obs. 15.35 S. Long. 29.18 W by Chron.

Ocean Charles Fisher Master A.D. 1836

Remarks on Wednesday 3^d Aug 1836

Came with moderate breezes from the S.E. and
fair weather at 2.10. spoke ship Ontario of
New York bearing out on S.E.
Middle and latter part much the same employed
repairing sails. Ship. Culam in Co.

Obs. Lat. 21.02 S. Long. 27.36 W

33 Days out

Remarks on Thursday 4th Sept. 1836

Came with fine breeze from the Eastward
and rising clouds steering to the S.E.
with all sail set. Middle part the same at 2.10.
raised a sail a head. Latter part squally employed
repairing sails. So ends with wind from S.E.
two ships in sight.

Obs. Lat. 23.48 South. 27.19 W

34 Days out

Remarks on Friday 5th Sept. 1836

Came with fine breeze from the East steering to
the South with all necessary sail set. Two
sail in sight. Middle and latter part fine breeze
from the East steering S.E. with all sail
set. Two ships in sight off the beam one showing
English Colours.

Lat. Obs. 24.30 S. Long. 26.51 by Chron.
by Lunar 26.31

Remarks on Saturday 6th Sept. 1836

At 10.30 hours fine breeze from the S.E. all sail
set steering from S.E. to S.E. with the rigging
fore & aft. Lined up stumps mizen top getting masts
and a new sail. So ends with all hands busily
employed a number of sail in sight.

Lat. Obs. 26.41 S. 25.30 W
