Remarks on board Thursday 24th Nov 1836

Three 24 hour comes with fresh winds from the S.W. in the forenoon
Bore 40 Middle and latter part strong in the forenoon
The wind to the S.W. and ship sailing, so ends with light
air from the S.W. at 3.30 p.m. by 6.00

Remarks on Friday 25th Nov 1836

Commenced with light air from the South and pleasant
at 10.00 spoke ship John & Edward of N. London coming
and White, Middle and latter part Calms at 7.00 p.m. because
for a while killed him and sent him got the ship to the
last of strong & of 10.00 p.m. Calms at 10.00 p.m. and
with no wind so ends with Calms & calm pleasant
3.40 p.m. 62.31 E

Remarks on Saturday 26th Nov 1836

Commenced with Calms & pleasant ship John & Edward
at 10.00 spoke ship John & Edward of N. London coming
and White, Middle and latter part pleasant weather wind
from the N.W. at 10.00 p.m. lowered and took one whale to
the ship at 10.00 p.m. lowered and killed and sent a whale
which took 3000 lbs. of line sent a maul & 10.00
at 10.00 p.m. 62.31 E

Remarks on Sunday 27th Nov 1836

found main top sail gave strong very good

Commenced from the North and fair weather
at 10.00 p.m. lowered and took one whale to the ship
and sent him for the maul
at 10.00 p.m. lowered and took another whale to the ship
with strong winds from the North & rough 3.30 p.m. 62.31 E

Monday 28th Nov 1836

Fresh breeze from the North and thick Cut in the
Whale & continued Boiling at 10.00 p.m. the Wind holed
the S.W. & lighter up Middle & latter part fine breeze
from the N.W. at 10.00 p.m. lowered and took a whale to the
ship & cut him in so ends with strong winds from
the S.W. in the forenoon Boiling & one ship in sight to windward
at 10.00 p.m. 61.56 E

Tuesday 29th Nov 1836

Strong winds from the N.W. under short sail at 10.00 p.m. spoke
Ship Ann & Men of N. London coming from the N.W.
Middle and latter part part strong gale from the N.W.
at 10.00 p.m. spoke ship to the N.W. so ends with
strong gale in the forenoon Boiling saw a number
of whales to windward ship at 10.00 p.m.
at 10.00 p.m. 61.56 E

In the Indian Ocean Charles Fisher Master 1836

Remarks on Wednesday 30th Nov 1836

Strong winds from the N.W. and rough gale wind
to the N.W. and double reefed main top sail
of fore sail, Middle and latter part strong
gale at 10.00 p.m. spoke ship to the N.W. so ends with strong
gale in the forenoon Boiling saw a number of whales
ship Ann & Men in sight at 10.00 p.m.

Thursday 1st Dec 1836

Strong winds from the N.W. & the wind
to the N.W. under short sail at 10.00 p.m. finished Boiling
Middle and latter part heavy gale from the N.W.
at 10.00 p.m. spoke ship to the N.W. so ends with strong
gale in the forenoon Boiling saw a number of whales
ship Ann & Men in sight at 10.00 p.m.

Friday 2nd Dec 1836

Commenced with strong gale from the North and
heavy rain and Calms in the forenoon sail & spoke
at 10.00 p.m. spoke ship to the N.W. so ends with strong
gale in the forenoon Boiling saw a number of whales
ship Ann & Men in sight at 10.00 p.m.

Remarks on board Saturday 3rd Dec 1836

Commenced with fresh winds from the N.W. &
at 10.00 p.m. spoke ship to the N.W. so ends with strong
gale in the forenoon Boiling saw a number of whales
ship Ann & Men in sight at 10.00 p.m.

Sunday 4th Dec 1836

Fresh breeze from the Westward looked on and
Cut in the whole but his head near sail to the N.W.
Middle and latter part moderate breeze from
the N.W. at 10.00 p.m. spoke ship to the N.W. so ends with strong
gale in the forenoon Boiling saw a number of whales
ship Ann & Men in sight at 10.00 p.m.

Monday 5th Dec 1836

at 10.00 p.m. finished Boiling at 10.00 p.m. lowered and took
a whale to the ship & sent him for the maul
Middle and latter part moderate breeze from
the N.W. at 10.00 p.m. spoke ship to the N.W. so ends with strong
gale in the forenoon Boiling saw a number of whales
ship Ann & Men in sight at 10.00 p.m.
