second boat following the first the first with
the Green from the first boat and we could
not quit first again to him by the

at 7 AM finished bagging more sail and steered

Coun S.E. at 12 PM made the island
of Flores bearing per compass S.E. by E. 15 leagues
Mist and later part gradually saw a number of

the first part strong winds from the S.W. Coun
S.E. mist part much the same wind weather

at 5 PM Fogal bearing per compass S.E. by E.
