The first part strong wind from the West by N & E
While and later part moderate from the West & NW
by E all sail set on board the main topsail
and last another second hand sail set.

Sunday Nov 4th

The first part moderate wind from the West all sail set
by E & N & E While and later part strong gale from
the NW & took in the light sail at 6 AM set the topsails

Monday Nov 5th

The first part strong gale from the North at 4 PM moderate
at 6 PM wind shifted to the South with heavy gale
at 1 PM took in four & main topsails and double reef

Remarks on A Sparrow Whirl Passage towards San Rafael
Thursday November 8th 1834

The first part moderate wind from the Westward While
part much the same later part strong gale from
the North with rain at 10 AM heavy gale took in
four & main topsails and double reef the main
ships cover & S & weather thick

Friday November 9th

The first part strong gale with rain ship under double reef
topsails cover & S & E While part squally with rain
later part strong gale from the West by E & S under
double reef four & main topsails by Alt at 4 PM

Clear Bar at 11.25 1/2 ft

Saturday November 10th

The first part strong gale from the NW by N & W
ship under double reef four & main topsails at 8 PM
Main St Pauls on the horizon at 11 PM I have
been for compass out about 18 miles in rain but
think that that chronometer is correct the ship
has gone after the route of 8 1/2 north since we got
a set of Altitudes While and later part heavy gale
from the West with hail squalls and rain rain
ship covers at 8 PM & by 9 under double reef topsails

Sunday Nov 11th

The first part strong gale from the NW ship under double
reef topsails while and later part more the same
ship cover & by 1 PM at 11 PM some plenty of Spanish
Whale but too greyed to care for them
