the N. E. W. steering N. E. middle and latter
much the same Lat. 43.45 South Long 156.46 East
Chro Rate 1.43 fath fast

Wednesday December 5th 1838
this 24 hours commences with fine weather wind
from the N. E. W. steering N. E. middle and latter
wind hauls to the S. W. S. E. Chro Rate 1.43 fath
Lat 42.26 South Long 157.47 East

Thursday December 6th 1838
the first part of this 24 hours strong gails from the
S. E. W. steering N. E. middle and latter part light
squalls of rain Lat 40.48 South Long 161.15 East
Chro Rate 00.01.44 fath fast

Friday December 7th 1838
First Part strong breezes from the S. W. and equally
steering N. E. At 2 P.M. saw whales lower to
boats found them to the humpbacks returned on board
steard our coars as before Lat 38.41 S Long 163.25 E
Chro Rate 00.01.44 fath fast

Saturday December 8th 1838
First Part of this 24 hours strong gails from the S. E. W.
steering N. E. by N middle and latter the same
So end employed in sundry duties Lat 36.55 S Long 165.52 E
Chro Rate 00.01.45 fath fast

Sunday December 9th 1838
First Part of this 24 hours strong gails from the S. E. W.
and cloudy weather steering N. E. by N middle and
latter wind hauls to the S. E. W. with sun equals
of wind and rain Lat 34.51 South Long 168.13 E
Monday Dec 10th Chro Rate 00.01.45 fath fast

This 24 hours commences with strong gails and
equally weather steering N. E. by N at 6 P.M.
sable reef the topsails steard E. E. E. Latter part
at 2.15 P.M. made all sail Lat 33.59 South Long 170.53 E
Chro Rate 00.01.46 fath fast

Tuesday December 11th 1838

the first part of this 24 hours light winds
from the S. E. steering E. by N at 6 P.M.
sable reef the topsails steard ship to the S. W.
at 12 midnight took steard East Lat 33.59 S Long 172.13 E
at 3 P.M. Chro. Rate 00.01.46 fath fast

Wednesday December 12th 1838
the first part of this 24 hours fine breezes from
the N. E. W. steering E. by N at 1 P.M. saw the
three kings Bairing S. E. by E. by E. Peter compass dist
30 miles at the same time saw a shoal of whales
going to windward lowerd chaist returned on board
without success. Middle part much the same later
part light equals of rain with strong winds from the
West at 1 P.M. steard down E. N. E. saw ends by three
Lat by th. 33.21 Long in 174.51.30 E
Chro Rate 00.01.47 fath fast

Thursday December 13th
the first part fine winds from the West lower E. N. E.
saw plenty of humpfish. Middle part strong gails from
S. W. later moderate saw nothing all sail set down
E. N. E. saw ends by three

Lat by th. 32.34 Long 175.03.18 E
Chro Rate 00.01.47 fath fast

Friday December 14th
the first part weather fine all sail set with light
wind from the West lower E. N. E. Middle and latter part
much the same lower E. N. E. all sail set saw nothing
Lat by th. 32.47 Long in by th. 175.58
Chro Rate 00.01.48 fath fast

Saturday December 15th
the first part fine and pleasant all sail set lower
E. N. E. saw nothing at 2 P.M. took in sail and here the ship
too heading S. E. Middle part moderate later part pleasant
breezes from the S. W. at 4 P.M. made all sail and steard E. by E.
Lat by th. 32.04 Long by th. 178.45 West
Chro Rate 00.01.48 fath fast
