Thursday September the 10. 1840

The first part weather fine with fine wind from
the West Coast N.E. by E. Mile and later part
much the same weather saw fine birds

Lat by Ch. 27.22 Long by Ch. 178.41 45 E
Friday Sept the 11 Chro Ralt 11 41 1/2 slow

The first part weather fine all sail set Coast S.E.
with moderate wind from the North Mile
and later part much the same weather saw fine birds

Lat by Ch. 28.12 Long by Ch. 178.53.30 E
Saturday Sept the 12 Chro Ralt 11 41 1/2 slow

The first part weather fine with fine breeze from the
North Mile part moderate later part squally
lay up East of E by N

Lat by Ch. 28.43 Long by Ch. 179.27 30 E
Sunday Sept the 13 Chro Ralt 11 42 slow

The first part strong wind and squally from
the N.W. at 5 PM steered Coast S.E. Mile part much
the same later part strong wind and squally

Lat by Art 28.45 Long by Art 179.53 West
Monday Sept 14 Chro Ralt 11 42 1/2 slow

The first part squally at 1 PM double reef with
strong gale at 4 PM the wind heaved to the S.W.
with strong gale and rain Mile and later part
squally with strong wind from the S.W. strong
Coast S.E. saw fine birds By Chro

The first part strong gale and ragged wind from
the S.W. Coast S.E. by E under close reef top sails
Mile and later part much the same

Wednesday Sept 16 the Chro Ralt 11 42 1/2

The first part strong wind from the W.S.W. Coast S.E. saw
nothing Mile and later part strong wind and rain
saw nothing Dist

Wednesday September the 17 1840

The first part weather fine all sail set Coast S.E.
Mile and later part much the same at 8 AM saw
a right whale going quick to the N.W. West

Lat by Ch. 34.54 Long by Ch. 178.59
Thursday Sept the 18 Chro Ralt 11 43 slow

The first part weather fine all sail set Coast N.E. at 8 PM
double reef the top sails Mile and later part much the same
at 6 AM five ships in sight at 10 AM spoke the ship
California of New London 11 miles 1900 at 12 Mer saw
a ship take a whale rain not near

Friday Sept the 19 Chro Ralt 11 43 1/2 slow

The first part weather fine all sail set saw fine birds
and ship Mile and later part much the same
one ship in sight saw end Chro

Lat by Ch. 33.32 Long by 178.53.30
Long by Dist at 8 AM 174.138 West
Saturday Sept the 20 Chro Ralt 11 43 1/2

The first part weather fine all sail set saw plenty of
fine birds one sail in sight Mile and later part
strong gale and rain at 12 Mer saw a large school
of sperm whales going quick to the N.W. West
the boats chair could not quit up to them saw end

Long by Dist at 8 AM 174.57.45 New Ralt 13.44 S
Monday Sept the 21 Chro Ralt 11 43 1/2 slow

The first part strong wind and ragged at 3 PM saw ship
in sight one nothing rain not near Mile at 4 PM
saw a right whale close to the ship to late to lose
Mile and later part moderate the ship in sight
one bylbying. Lat by Ch. 34.30 Long at 8 AM 173.57.30
Long by Dist rain fin 174.13
New Ralt 13.44 1/2 slow
Chro Ralt 11 43 1/2
