

Remarks On board Ship Mastha Fairhaven March 1842  
Tuesday March the 1 1842

first part strong breeze from SSE  
at 2 o'clock the topsails beating as  
the day at 4 o'clock came to an  
anchor full the sails except went  
on shore middle part strong breeze  
let go the small anchor latter part the same all hands  
employed in breaking out and getting casks ready for  
water so ends

Wednesday March the 2 1842  
set on raft of cork on shore wind at NNE latter part  
employed painting ca so ends

Thursday March the 3 1842  
first part light breeze from S  
ing at 6 got off the raft of water and took it in latter  
part wind at N all hands employed stowing water and  
painting ca so ends

Friday March the 4 1842  
first part wind at N and  
pugging painting and stowing some water at 5 o'clock  
up the small anchor and let go again latter part  
sent another raft on shore and stowing and painting so ends

Saturday March the 5 1842  
first part good weather got  
off the raft of water ca latter part starboard watch  
on duty and the other watch stowing and painting so ends

Sunday March the 6 1842  
first part stowing water and paint  
ing ca latter part Larboard watch on duty so ends

Monday March the 7 1842  
first part strong breeze from SSE at sunset  
the watch came off as ordered all but the coopers and beams  
the painter and Mr. Johnston the third mate and George Higgins  
latter part but they came off drunk not fit for duty employed  
getting off potatoes and 4 casks of water ca so ends

Remarks On board Ship Mastha Fairhaven March 1842  
Tuesday March the 8 1842

first part strong breeze from SSE  
have up the Larboard anchor and get all ready for sailing  
latter part at daylight under weigh at 10 went out by  
kassikena in company with 2 other ships stowed the anchors  
and unbent the chains so ends

Wednesday March the 9 1842  
first part strong breeze from SSE  
steering WNW 2 ships in sight at 6 o'clock recd the man  
top sail and then recd the fore top in the Mizzen ca  
sit hearts watches middle part strong breeze latter part  
strong moderate breeze sail at daylight watches employed  
setting up rigging ca so ends Lat Obs 32.35 S

Thursday March the 10 1842  
first part light breeze from  
steering WNW watches employed setting up rigging ca  
middle part light breeze from NW latter part came  
from NNE recd NNE saw black fish and pinbacks  
watches employed painting Mast so ends Lat Obs 32.48 S

Friday March the 11 1842  
first part light breeze from  
WNW headed N watches recd watches employed middle  
part light breeze from NW headed WNW latter part  
the same at daylight made sail watches employed  
in ships duty so ends Lat Obs 33.00 S  
Long beam 46.00 W

Saturday March the 12 1842  
first part light breeze from  
by N headed WNW watches employed in ships duty at  
4 bent the old main top sail and main top sail  
middle part wind from NNE headed W latter part strong breeze  
from NNE steered NNE bent the old main top sail so ends  
Lat Obs 32.25 S

Sunday March the 13 1842  
first part strong breeze from NNE  
steered NNE saw a big boat the old fore top sail and  
part steered N latter part the same steered NNE so ends  
Lat Obs 31.55 S

Monday March the 14 1842  
first part strong breeze from  
NNE steered N at night steered N middle part steered  
NNE latter part steered NNE strong breeze watches employed  
in ships duty so ends Lat Obs 27.48 S  
Long beam 55.25 W
